

Warm Winters. The following record of unusually warm winters may be of interest in view of the exceptionally warm weather of our present winter.

In 1172 the temperature was so high in England that leaves came out on the trees in January, and birds hatched their broods in February.

In 1280 the winter was equally mild, and the gardens of Cologne were full of flowers and fruit in January and on the Twelfth Day.

In 1421 the trees flowered in the month of April. Cherries opened in the same month, and grapes appeared in May.

In 1562 the trees were covered with leaves in January, and the birds hatched their young in February, as in 1172. 1555 the same thing was repeated and it is added that the corn was in a better state than in France.

The record shows that in New England in 1735, January was pleasant and moderate. In 1738 January came in like April, in 1740 there were but two snow storms.

In 1751, January 15th, the frost was entirely out of the ground, and February was like spring, and the winter ends a wonder through the globe.

In 1756, in January, the fish, as they are reported to have done this year, "struck in" from the north, the weather being so warm.

In 1773, Mr. Smith records a summer day on January 27th, "wonderful moderate." On February 9th "no snow since December 22nd, wonderful weather."

Did you ever notice what a different aspect everything wears in the view of the the original warm weather of our present winter?
