THE vote for Governor in Tennessee was: Porter, 123,740; Thomas, 73,025; Maney, 10,230; Yardley, 2,165; Hughes, 506; total, 210,632. Porter's plurality over Thomas, 50,715; over Maney, 113,204; over Yardley, 121,075; over Hughes, 123,144. Porter's majority over all his competitors, 36,848.

CITY COUNCIL. In consequence of the Presidential election occurring on the first Tuesday in this month, the regular monthly meeting was deferred until the 21st inst., when the full board assembled. Monthly reports of collections, etc., of all the city officers were made and referred to the annual committee for examination. Street committee reported that during the past month under their direction thirty-two notices had been served on property-owners, requiring immediate and thorough repairs on sidewalks. Fire committee reported in favor of purchasing 1000 ft. of gun hose, and on the recommendation a contract was duly entered into with B. F. Goodrich & Co., Akron, Ohio, to supply same within twenty days, at 15 per foot. The Mayor and Street Committee were instructed to construct immediately a fire cistern in 3d ward. Alderman Johnson made known to the Board that a responsible party was ready to enter into a contract and proceed with the extension of Commerce from Seventh to Eight street (the eastern limit of the city) as provided by resolution adopted May 2, 1876, for the consideration of \$1,000 in city bonds. After considerable discussion the proposition was lost. The Board instructed the keeper of the calaboose to release no prisoners in future except on an order from the City Recorder. The Board then adjourned.

Tobacco Sales. Our market begins to show more activity, and our public and private sales for the week amount to 50 or 60 hhds. Prices were well sustained, and are relatively higher than those ruling at the seaboard. Now that buyers and sellers have arrived at a basis of values, we may hope to see the old stock move, which will distribute some \$200,000 or \$300,000 in our section, where it is no doubt needed. The stock on hand being worth no doubt the above amount. We quote

LETTER FROM N. ORLEANS.

Col. R. H. Marr to Gen. A. W. Campbell of Jackson Tenn. Dear Sir—Our true policy is to let the Northern people settle this matter. If they choose to allow Louisiana to be disfranchised, if they choose to permit the President, backed by the Army and Navy, to elect a President, we must submit, because, if we should strike a single blow for our liberty, for our Constitutional rights, a solid North would soon descend upon us like an avalanche, and would crush out the last hope for us of free Government. Almost single handed Louisiana has fought the battle of Constitutional liberty, and the right of self-government, for three years past. It was the battle of the Union, for of each and all the States. At last she has succeeded in bringing these stupendous issues before the proper tribunal, the people of the United States; and she now pauses, awaiting, with patience and dignity, the verdict and judgment of this grand tribunal. What the result may be, I know not, but she will not permit the momentous, the all-important interests involved, by any act tending to precipitate a conflict, or to relieve the Federal administration of the odium, the guilt, which justly attach to it for the ruthless invasion of our unoffending States, in a time of peaceful peace, and for revolutionizing, and destroying Constitutional Government, for the interest of a shamefully corrupt and disgraced party, under the flimsy pretext of preserving the public peace.

What a Colored Editor of Tennessee Knows about it—The Cause of the Popular Revolution in South Carolina. W. B. Scott, Sr., colored, the intelligent and Conservative editor of the Maryland Republican, writes as follows to the Knoxville Tribune: MARYVILLE, TENN., Nov. 22, 1876. Republican partisan journals are now having a great deal to say about the "intimidation" policy of the Southern Democracy. Having spent five weeks in the States of North and South Carolina, mingling freely with both races and seeing the political situation truthfully, state, without egotism or prejudice, that the greatest "intimidation" and "terror" in the Republic is in those States. It is the Republican party. Colored men who dare exercise the privilege of citizenship as they see fit, are being persecuted for the Democracy, are in more danger of violence and proscription than those who vote the "straight Republican ticket."

Scattering the Relics of Old Hickory. The Philadelphia Press of a recent date contains the following: "It is always sad to hear that the relatives of any of our great statesmen are being persecuted in the remotest part of the world. The daughter-in-law of Gen. Jackson, a devoted woman who ministered to his wants, who was by his side when he died, and whom the General loved as his only child, is compelled by narrow circumstances to part with her valuable relics.
