

Weekly Report of the Board of Health for July.

The board reports this month important sanitary improvements, the result of the domiciliary visits of the sanitary inspectors, such as the removal of filth from houses and yards, and especially livery stables.

The meteorological phenomena noted are exceptional humidity in the atmosphere, with a wide range of thermometric variation between night and day, resulting in intestinal disorder and malarial fevers.

It is remarked that four cases of sudden death from heart-disease and apoplexy occurred within a space of eight days, a very unusual coincidence.
