A number of 1,200 lb. bulls sold for 2¼ to 2½ cts.; common milch cows, \$20 to \$30; 500 good mountain ewes sold in lots at \$2.25 to \$2.50 each; a few lots of hogs brought 3¼ cts.—Winchester Democrat.
