Mineral Land

Assessment in Lee County Greatly Increased.

Bristol, Va., Nov. 17, '10.

Mr. Jno. W. Chalkley, Big Stone Gap, Va.

Dear Sir:

I thank you for calling my attention to reports being circulated in Lee county to the effect that I am acting in the interest of the coal companies and have taken from the Commissioner of the Revenue their books and lowered the assessments.

The slightest investigation will show that anyone circulating such reports is very much mistaken, or has not the slightest regard for truth.

My duties are clearly defined under Section 437 a of the Code, as amended February 19, 1910. The Act directs the land assessors and myself to agree on the assessment for 1910, and the Commissioners of the Revenue and myself to agree on the assessment for 1911. I have no right to arbitrarily fix any assessment, and in every case have agreed with the local assessor, and I know the testimony of hundreds of assessors all over Virginia will show that I have tried to get a fair assessment, and that not for one minute have I lost sight of the interest of the Commonwealth or the county in which the assessment was.

The mineral land assessment in Virginia will show an increase of about \$9,000,000.00.

The mineral land assessment for Lee county for 1910, \$898,541.00; the mineral land assessment for 1909 was \$723,163.00, which is an increase for 1910 over 1909 of \$175,378.00.

The detailed assessment of Lee county is as follows.

This makes the increase in assessment of mineral land in Lee county 24.25 per cent.

The increase in Wise county is 35.5 per cent.

The law directs the land assessors to give a copy of said assessment to the Commissioner of Revenue, Clerk of the Court, Treasurer, and to keep one copy, and anyone interested can very readily see the books, which will speak for themselves.

In view of the reports which are being circulated, I wish you would use this letter to contradict the same. Such reports are so unjust and unfair that they should not stand. I do not care what use is made of my acts as a sworn official of this State so long as the truth is told.

Civic League Column

EDITED BY THE LEAGUE.

Meetings, First Friday of Each Month.

During the winter while nature is dormant, and there is little that can be done to beautify the exterior of our premises, the League has resolved to do everything possible for the protection of public health. In this connection, we wish to call the attention of the mayor and health officers, as well as of every private citizen to the below quoted rules and regulations of the State Board of Health, adopted July 13, 1910, effective September 1, 1910.

Rule 22 Any church, hall, theater, or other building used for public meetings shall be kept at all times in a clean and sanitary condition. Every such building shall be provided with proper means for maintaining purity of the atmosphere while in use and such means must be employed at all times.

Rule 23. All buildings used for public meetings shall be cleaned after each meeting held in them, such cleaning to consist of thorough sweeping of floors and wiping of wood work, together with opening of all windows and doors to permit the entrance of fresh air and sunshine. No such building or room shall be swept without first sprinkling the floor with water or throwing on it damp sawdust or other absorbent material to prevent dust. Woodwork shall be wiped down with a damp cloth, and dry dusting with feathers or dry cloths shall not be practiced.

Rule 24. An ample number of spittoons or cupids shall be furnished, which shall contain sufficient water to stand one-half inch deep on the bottom. They shall be emptied, washed and disinfected after each day's use with an improved disinfectant.

The League is investigating the cost of sanitary drinking fountains for our Public School, and bespeak the assistance of the public in having them installed in the near future, as we realize that they are the greatest safeguards to the health of the students in our school.


