HAPPENINGS IN AND AROUND THE CITY.

GATHERED BY OUR REPORTER.

Business Transacted in the Hastings Court Yesterday—Roanoke's Water Supply—A Good Appointment.

In the Hastings court yesterday the case of Alexander Barnett vs. the Norfolk and Western Railroad company, occupied a large share of attention. Mr. Barnett sues for damages from the loss of an arm. When the court adjourned yesterday afternoon the case was still before it. Mr. Brown, of the law firm of Saunders & Brown, of Liberty, represented Barnett, and made a very able speech in behalf of his client.

Roanoke's Water Supply.

Mr. Howard Murphy left here yesterday afternoon for Lynchburg, to confer with the managers of the Glomorgan and Mr. J. B. Foley in regard to the water pipes which are to be laid in various parts of the city. He says no pipe smaller than four inches will be laid for the street water supply of the city, and that on Spruce street, from Holiday to Jefferson, twelve-inch pipes will be laid. From Jefferson street to the Franklin road a ten-inch pipe will be laid, and in all the rest of the city due regard in laying pipes will be had to the future growth of Roanoke, in which Mr. Murphy, like nearly everybody else, has great faith.

Good Appointments.

Mr. Wilbur S. Pole, one of the most popular young men in this city, received yesterday from Governor Lee, through Colonel J. A. Molton, his commission as captain of ordinance in the Second Virginia regiment. Dr. Hunter St. John also received from the same source his commission as assistant surgeon of the same regiment. Both appointments are good ones, and so far as Captain Pole is concerned, his instincts are wholly military, and if a war should occur he will give a good account of himself.

A Large Land Purchase.

A company of Roanoke capitalists has been formed for the purchase of the Sexton property of 140 acres on the western border of the city, which purchase was effected yesterday at the price of \$50,000. The company will hold a meeting about the 20th of the month to elect a president and board of directors, and all the indications are that Mr. C. Markley will be president of the company. The purchase was effected through the agency of that energetic and reliable real-estate man, Mr. Francis B. Kemp, of this city.

Baptist Orphanage.

Rev. Dr. A. E. Dickinson delivered a very interesting address at the Baptist church Sunday night. He left here yesterday for Salem to see about the location of a Baptist orphan asylum in this section. Nearly \$10,000 have been subscribed, and the probabilities are that the orphanage will be located somewhere between this city and Salem.

Marriage of a Welsh Couple.

Mr. David G. Evans, of Caermarthenshire and Miss Jane Williams, of Glamorganshire, Wales, were married by the Rev. W. C. Campbell, at the Presbyterian Manse Saturday evening last at 7 o'clock. They were accompanied by a number of their Welsh friends. The young couple will make their future home in Pulaski City, Virginia.

General Manager Joseph H. Sands, of the Norfolk and Western Railroad company, will be present this morning before the interstate commerce commission at Washington to listen to argument on an application of John Longlin, of New York, regarding the issuing of passes to employees and their families.
