Items of Interest on Various Subjects From All Parts of the State.

E. M. Henry qualified yesterday as mayor of Norfolk.

Portions of the body of a man were found under a Virginia Midland railroad train at Lynchburg Monday.

It is reported that General B. F. Butler is interested in a scheme for a railroad through Palestine from Port Said to Damascus.

Mr. Bowden, of Virginia, yesterday introduced in the House a bill appropriating the sum of \$150,000 for a public building at Portsmouth, Virginia.

Mr. Jacob Puller, the venerable librarian of Washington and Lee University, whose illness has been announced, is at the point of death to-night and cannot possibly survive.

A detective named Jackson went disguised as a foot peddler to hunt Babe Burrows in the mountains of Alabama. A few days ago his dead body was found in the woods riddled with bullets.
