FROM SHOP AND SIDEWALK.

Personal Mention. Marriage Licenses Issued. Sale of Tobacco Stamps. A Roanoke Invention. Three Trains of Cattle for Shipment.

The \$25,000 necessary to secure a shoe factory at Alexandria has been subscribed.

In Logan County, W. Va., M. C. Lee shot and killed Jerry Hatfield.

Aunspugh & Cobbs, dry goods merchants of Lynchburg, have made an assignment.

Mike Haley badly knocked out Prof. Watson in a glove contest at Norfolk.

T. P. Corder, proprietor of Corder's livery stables, is very ill at his residence on Franklin Street southwest.

Lode Cramer (colored) was fined \$5 for loitering on the streets at 1:30 yesterday morning, and in default of payment was sent to jail.

A freight train on the Cumberland Valley and Martinsburg Railroad was derailed, and the engineer, fireman and conductor injured.

Preparations for laying a concrete pavement similar to that in front of the general offices of the Norfolk and Western Railroad Company.

Willie Boyd, a ten year old son of Rev. J. H. Boyd, pastor of the M. E. Church, South, died yesterday afternoon, at 4:30 o'clock.

The sale of tobacco stamps received by Deputy Internal Revenue Collector Pattie for the month of March amounted to \$823.85.

Mrs. B. K. Stearns died on Thursday morning at the residence of her son-in-law, Mr. B. S. Webb near this city.

Extensive preparations for church decorations for Easter Sunday are in progress. The ladies are also selecting new millinery, so the husbands say.

It is said that the lands in Rappahannock county will be reduced by the new assessment from an average of \$11 an acre to an average of about \$7 an acre.

Three trains, of thirty cars each, loaded with cattle, passed through the city yesterday morning on the Norfolk and Western Railroad, en route to Norfolk for shipment east.

The Rockbridge and Amherst tin mines have been rented to a Boston company for \$60,000, with an option to purchase the mines for \$200,000 within two years.

Jas. I. Doran, counsel for the Norfolk and Western Railroad Company, arrived here yesterday morning in company with Mr. Eggleston, a fire brick manufacturer from Philadelphia, and left at 10 a. m. for Radford.

Mr. Luther Miller, the real-estate agent, has an English half-penny of the date of 1775, which he has carried a pocket piece for twenty years. He also has an American half cent piece of the date of 1809.

It is stated that the Grand Army of the Republic contemplates erecting a hotel and a number of cottages upon that portion of the Cedar Creek battle ground, recently purchased by the organization.

Mr. C. P. Kanode, from the neighborhood of Blacksburg, was in the city yesterday. Mr. Kanode is a brother-in-law of Mr. M. P. Scott and both gentlemen are interested in coal mines in Montgomery county.

A young man in Roanoke has invented a car coupler which promises success. The present link and pin mode of coupling cars has killed more men than the war between the States.

Mr. Robert G. Pace, of Salem, well-known here as a former resident, was in the city yesterday. Mr. Pace is in the real-estate business at Salem, and says the outlook of the sister city is decidedly promising.

Judge S. G. Williams has been attending Circuit Court in Salem for the past two days as counsel for the plaintiffs in the cases of Bakersville & Smizer vs. Heslip and Perry & Co. vs. Stover. He will go there again today.

Messrs. W. D. Smith and Dave Evans were fined two dollars each yesterday by the mayor for fighting. The altercation began on Salem avenue, west of Roanoke street, and concluded on Campbell street, near the Greene Memorial Church.

The Midway Land Company met last night in the office of Tavener & Airhart, on Salem avenue, to consider certain improvements on their property before putting the land on the market. The officers of the company are: Dr. H. A. Sims, president; T. G. Massie, secretary, and J. A. Fishburne, treasurer.

The new assessment in Fredericksburg shows taxable real estate in the corporate limits to be \$1,172,874. The amount of realty exempted from taxation is \$137,900, which makes a total of \$1,330,474. The increase of real estate over last year is over \$25,000, and does not include a number of new buildings now in course of erection.
