

ORDINANCE.

An ordinance fixing salaries of justices of the peace and constables in the parish of Vermilion.

Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the parish of Vermilion in regular session assembled; That from and after the First day of July A. D. 1898, the following shall be the salaries of the justices of the peace and constables of the several wards of the parish of Vermilion:

Table with 2 columns: Ward, Per annum. Lists salaries for various wards and positions like justice of the peace and constable.

And no other fees shall be allowed in criminal cases, same to be allowed quarterly and paid in regular turn. Adopted.

An ordinance providing means for the purpose of constructing and maintaining public roads and bridges throughout the parish of Vermilion:

Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the parish of Vermilion in legal assembly convened; There shall be included in the levy on the assessment roll for the year 1898 in addition to the regular budget for road purposes as follows:

Table listing various items and their costs: A per capita tax of one dollar on all male persons between the ages of eighteen and fifty-five years inclusive. And a special license on all vehicles as follows: On wagons \$1.00 per annum. Carts 75. Hacks 75. Buggies 2 horse 75. Bicycles 50. Sulkies 50.

Same to be placed on the assessment rolls of 1898 and collected by the tax collector with taxes of the regular budget and placed to the credit of the road and bridge fund.

Be it further ordained; That all persons who may produce their receipts for full payment of their per capita tax and vehicle license duly assessed against them yearly shall be relieved from personal service on the public roads of this parish from and after January 1, 1898.

Be it further ordained; That any person refusing to pay his per capita tax or license legally assessed against him shall be required to perform personal service on the public roads for Twelve full days of 8 hours under the contractor of that district in which he may reside. Anyone failing to comply with the terms of this ordinance shall on due conviction thereof be subject to a fine of ten dollars for each offense and costs of court or twenty days in the parish prison or both at the discretion of the court.

This ordinance to take effect and be in full force from July 1, 1898. Adopted.

Be it ordained by the Police Jury of Vermilion parish in regular session convened; That from and after the passage of this ordinance any parties who may be convicted of casting any paper, or other trash on the courthouse yard, shall be fined not less than fifty cents nor more than one dollar for each offense. 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schools of this parish during the session just closed 49 teachers in all, 46 white and 3 colored.

I am pleased to report in this connection that during the last session our teachers as a body were better qualified than any previous body of teachers employed by your Hon. Board in this parish. They held certificates of grades and received salaries as follows:

Table showing teacher salaries: 19 1st grade salary \$40.00 per mo., 18 2d " " 35.00, 12 3rd " " 25.00.

ATTENDANCE.

I have to report that the attendance, as a rule, has been very irregular, in fact irregularity was the rule and regularity was the exception.

The most frequent cause in my opinion is parental indifference. I am unable to suggest any adequate means to enforce regular attendance in all cases under our present system and laws.

I believe however that if each member of the School Board would investigate each and every case of irregular attendance arising in his ward it would go very far toward correcting this evil, and that finally a full and regular attendance could be secured at every school.

MISCELLANEOUS MATTERS.

I have further to report, that with few exceptions the new school houses being built are small, incommensurate and unsuitable for school purposes. I would recommend that your Hon. Board, whenever a new school is established hereafter, designate and specify the size and quality of the building which shall be constructed for a school house in the same ordinance by which the new school is created.

This I consider a necessity also; as during the winter months, not only the health, but the lives of the school children, are endangered by sitting in a house which has none of the qualities necessary to make it comfortable.

I have to report also that a State Normal Institute for teachers was held for one week in Abbeville in the month of May. The Institute was conducted by Prof. Showalter, one of the corps of State Institute Conductors, and was attended by every teacher employed in our parish with few exceptions. The Institute was a success, our teachers being greatly benefited by the instructions there given as to methods of teaching.

The financial standing of the School Board will be seen by reference to the reports of the finance committee of your Hon. body, which will be published from time to time.
