Abbeville, La. Nov. 6th, 1905. The Town Council met at the Court House in regular monthly session. There were present, Mayor Jos. R. Legueneo and Aldermen Dr. C. J. Edwards, V. L. Caldwell and Jas. A. Summers. Absent O. Bourque.

The minutes of two previous meetings were adopted as read. The Treasurer and Collector submitted their reports for the month of October, which were read and turned over to the Finance Committee for their approval.

Constable and Excelsior Tax Roll. Bill of O. H. O'Bryan, was on motion turned over to the City Attorney, bill of A. W. Stebbins, turned over to the Board of Health.

On motion duly seconded, a committee composed of Messrs Edwards, Summers were appointed by the Mayor to appear before the Jury at their next meeting and endeavor to secure from that body a balance of the \$500.00, appropriated for quarantine purposes.

On motion, the Street and Sewerage Committee were to act jointly with the City Attorney to confer with the Health Officer regarding right of way through her property for street purposes.

On motion duly seconded, the sum of \$765.36 was appropriated out of the General Fund, to meet all bills incurred by the Board of Health, for the existence of quarantine and Secretary was authorized to pay same as per itemized bill rendered by R. J. Young, President of the Board.

The bill of Eli Wise & Co., bill of Republican Idea \$4.50 and of LeBlanc & Hebert \$10.50 were ordered paid.

On motion, the Council adjourned. Jos. R. Legueneo, Mayor. Geo. W. Summers, Secretary. Abbeville, La. Nov. 6th, 1905.

The waterworks committee met at the Court House pursuant to a call by the Chairman, with all members present excepting Mr. Bourque in attendance.

Mr. Mackintosh appeared and submitted plans and estimates of the cost of the construction of the waterworks and sewerage system; the adoption of same was deferred.

On motion, a committee composed of Messrs Eli. Wise, D. L. McPherson and G. Godechaux were appointed to secure opinion on site for pump plant, and report on Monday 7-30 o'clock P. M.

On motion, the meeting adjourned. Jos. R. Legueneo, Chairman. Geo. W. Summers, Clerk. Abbeville, La. Nov. 13th, 1905.

Pursuant to adjournment, the Waterworks Committee met at the Court House, with Chairman Legueneo and Messrs C. J. Edwards, G. Godechaux, Jas. A. Summers and D. L. McPherson present.

Owing to the absence of the Clerk Jas. A. Summers was appointed in his stead.

It was moved and carried that Mr. Mackintosh Civil Engineer employed by the Committee be authorized to advertise for sealed bids for furnishing the material or doing the work necessary for the construction of a water works and Electric Light Plant for the town of Abbeville, La.

Bids to be addressed to the Secretary of the Town Council and to be in his hands not later than Monday Dec. 18th, 1905.

On motion, the committee appointed at last meeting to secure opinion on site, were granted until Friday 11th. Inst. to make their report.

There being no further business, the Committee adjourned to meet on Friday at 7 o'clock P. M. Jos. R. Legueneo, Chairman. Jos. A. Summers, Acting, Clerk.
