His remains arrived here Saturday evening and were buried in the Catholic Cemetery after high mass Monday morning. He is survived by a widow and 6 brothers. A good man and exemplary citizen has gone. Peace to thy ashes old friend.

For the protection of Quail or Partridges in this parish. INFORMATION REGARDING ELECTRIC LIGHTS & FANS

- To secure current rates the number of lights must be one installation, controlled by one switch.
- All changes in location of lights after installation will be charged for according to labor and material employed.
- Whenever meters are desired, the meter, wire, installation, etc., is at customers' expense.
- Meter rate is 20 cents per kilowatt hour—equivalent to one cent an hour for each 16-candle-power lamp.
- All work is at consumers' expense, and will be charged according to labor and material employed.
- Fixtures, shades, etc., charged extra.
- All lamps broken by customers must be paid for by consumers. Fans are paid for by consumers and are installed and charged for according to labor and material employed. Rates for operating fans are: For ceiling fans, from \$5.00 per month to \$3-50 per month, according to number and location. Desk rotary fans of 12 and 16 inches at \$3.50 per month in any quantity or location.
