



OF CALUMET LAND AND TIMBER COMPANY.
UNITED STATES OF AMERICA. STATE OF LOUISLANA, PARISH OF ORLEANS, CITY OF NEW ORLEANS.
Be it known, that on this minth day of July, in the year of our Loud, one thousand nine hundred and twelve, and of the Independence of the United States of America, the one hundred and thirty-sixth, before me, Ross E. Breazeale, a notary public in and for the state and parish aforesaid, duly commissioned and qualified, and in the presence of the winesses hereignifier named and nu-

propriate to the powers hereinabove enumerated.

ARTICLE IV.

The capital stock of this corporation is hereby fixed at one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000), divided into and represented by one thousand (1,000) shares of stock, of the par value of one hundred dollars (\$100) each. Which said stock shall be paid for in cash or may be issued in payment of and for rights or property actually received by this corporation. All transfers of shares of the capital stock of this corporation shall be entered on the stock book and no transfer shall be in any manner binding on this corporation until so entered.

This corporation may become a going concern, and may commence business when twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) of its capital stock shall have been subscribed for.

ARTICLE V.

All of the corporate powers of this corporation shall be vested in and exercised by a board of directors, composed of three stockholders, two of whom shall constitute a quorum in the transaction of business.

Said directors shall be elected at a general meeting of the stockholders of this corporation to be held on the fifteenth day of April in each year, unless said day shall be a legal holday, in which event said election shall be held on the next succeeding business day.

Notice of said election shall be given by publication for seven successive days preceding the election, in a newspaper of general circulation published in the English language, in the city of New Orleans. Said board of directors shall at the first meeting of its board of directors elect a president, vice-president and secretary-treasurer.

The first election for directors under this charter shall be held and shall take place on the 9th day of July in the year nineteen hundred and twelve, and they shall serve until their successors shall have been duly elected and qualified.

ARTICLE VI.

The following shall constitute the first board of directors: Henry N. Sherburne, E. C. Glenn and C. S. Williams, and the said Henry N. Sherburne shall be president, the said E. C. Glenn shall be vice-president, and the said C. S. Williams shall be secretary-treasurer.

The failure for any cause to elect directors on the day stipulated shall not dissolve the corporation, but the officers and directors then in charge shall hold over until their successors shall have been duly elected and qualified. In the event of any failure to hold the election on the day stipulated, the president of our corporation, or, in his absence, the vice-president, shall immediately thereafter call a new election to be held after notice as hereinafter provided. At all elections and meetings of stockholders of this corporation each stockholders of this corporation each stockholders of this corporation each stockholders hall be entified to one vote for each share of stock registered in his name and may vote in person or by proxy.

The power and authority to sell, mortgage, encumber or otherwise dispose of the realty owned by this corporation shall be vested in the stockholders, according to their ginggment, expressed at a meeting called by the president, or in his absence, the vice-president under the instructions of the board of directors, and a majority of the stock shall control.

ARTICLE VIII.

This act of incorporation may be changed, modified or amended, and this corporation may be dissolved by and with the consent of a majority of the expetial stock of this corporation present or represented at a general meeting of the stockholders called for that purpose after notice given in the manner provided in Article V hereof.

Upon the dissolution of this charter by limitation or otherwise, its affairs shall be liquidated by the then president, vice-president and secretary-treasurer. Should either be unable or cease to act for any cause, the other two shall continue the liquidation alone.

ARTICLE IX.

The capital stock of this corporation may be increased or decreased in the manner now or heretofore provided for by the laws of this state.
