United States vs. Elmira Parker and Henry Dhillman, verdict for plaintiff and fixing the value of the property to be expropriated at \$750.

ANOTHER TRACT OF LAND EXPROPRIATED FOR IMMIGRATION STATION.

After a brief trial held before Judge Rufus E. Foster, of the United States District Court, the jury in the case of the United States vs. Elmira Parker and Henry Dhillman, an expropriation suit, returned a verdict in favor of the government and fixed the value of property and damages at \$750. The land expropriated is situated at Tunisburg, and is needed for the completion of the Immigration Station.

In the second suit, which was filed against Armstrong Donaldson and John Everett, the first-named defendant filed an answer yesterday stating that he was the sole owner of the land. He denies the correctness of the sketch of survey made by Daney and Waddill insofar as the same reduces the quantity of lands still owned by him, and also denies that it has been impossible to acquire the lands at a private sale, as he has at all times been willing to sell the property for \$1,000, which he claims to be a reasonable price. The case will be called for trial before Judge Foster to-day.

BREWERY UPHOLD IN CREDITORS' CASE.
FEDERAL JUDGE REFUSES RETRIAL—COMPANY IS SOLVENT.

Motion for a new trial was denied in the case of Schumert & Warfield, Ltd., versus the Security Brewing Company, of this city, in a decree handed down by Judge R. E. Foster, in federal district court, last Tuesday.
