ACT OF INCORPORATION OF THE J. H. VAN HORSSEN GROCERY COMPANY.

STATE OF LOUISIANA, PARISH OF ORLEANS, CITY OF NEW ORLEANS.

Be it known that on this fifth day of May, in the year one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, before me, William Renaudin, a notary public of Louisiana, duly commissioned and qualified, and in the presence of the witnesses hereinafter named and undersigned, personally came and appeared the persons whose names are hereunto subscribed, all above the full age of majority, who severally declared that availing themselves of the

provisions of an act of the legislature of this state known as Act No. 78 of the session of 1914, as well as of those of the general laws of this state relative to the organization of corporations, they have formed and organized and do hereby present, from themselves into and constitute a corporation and body politic in law, for the objects and purposes and under the stipulations and agreements hereinafter set forth and expressed, which they hereby adopt as their charter, to-wit:

ARTICLE I - The name and title of the corporation hereby formed is declared to be the "J. H. VAN HORSSEN GROCERY COMPANY," Orleans, State of Louisiana, and it shall have and enjoy succession by its corporate name, and after the death, disability and after the death hereof, all obligations or other legal process shall be served upon the president of the corporation, and in the absence of such officer, the same shall be served upon the vice-president, and in the absence of such officer, the same shall be served upon the secretary.

ARTICLE II - The objects and purposes for which this corporation is organized and the nature of the business to be carried on by it are hereby declared to be the retail grocery and liquor business and to do a general retail grocery and liquor and various business, and its liquid and various business, and its branches.

ARTICLE III - The capital stock of this corporation is hereby fixed at the sum of five hundred dollars (\$500.00) divided into five hundred shares of one dollar each, and shall be paid for in cash, at such times, in such amounts and manner as the board of directors may determine, and the same may be issued at not less than par in payment for property or rights actually received by the corporation, and such stock when so issued, shall be full paid and non-assessable, and the board of directors may, by resolution, issue and sell, mortgage or pledge the same; to borrow money, issue bonds, notes or other evidence of indebtedness; name and appoint such managers, agents, and employees as its interest and convenience may require and the board of directors may, by resolution, amend or change the same at pleasure.

ARTICLE IV - All the corporate powers of this corporation shall be vested in the board of directors of this corporation, a majority of whom shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of all business. The first board of directors of this corporation shall consist of John H. Van Hossen, Harry J. Van Hossen and William Renaudin, with John H. Van Hossen, vice-president, and Harry J. Van Hossen, secretary-treasurer, all of whom shall hold office until the second Monday in April, 1914, or until their successors shall have been duly elected and qualified. On the second Monday in April, 1914, and annually, an election for directors shall be held at the office of the corporation and the person or persons elected shall be appointed by the president, after ten days' prior notice of said election shall have been given in one of the daily newspapers published in the city of New Orleans three times during said ten days, and the person or persons so elected shall immediately take their seats and hold office until their successors shall have been duly elected and qualified. Each board of directors shall elect its own officers and fill all vacancies occurring in any other manner than death, resignation or any other cause. All elections shall be by ballot and a majority of votes cast shall elect and each share of stock shall be entitled to one vote either in person or proxy at all meetings of stockholders. This corporation shall commence business and become a going concern on the first day of May, 1914, and the capital stock shall have been subscribed for.

ARTICLE V - This act of incorporation may be changed, modified or amended by the assent of three-fourths of the capital stock present or represented at a meeting of the stockholders convened for that purpose after thirty days' prior notice shall have been given in one of the daily newspapers published in the city of New Orleans, five times during said thirty days, and such changes shall be in writing and in addition forty days' prior notice in writing by mail to each stockholder.

ARTICLE VI - Whenever this corporation is dissolved, either by limitation of its charter or from any other cause, its assets shall be liquidated by two commissioners to be elected from among the stockholders, at a meeting of the stockholders convened for that purpose after thirty days' prior notice of said meeting shall have been given to each stockholder by publication in one of the daily newspapers published in the city of New Orleans, five times during said thirty days. Said commissioners shall remain in office until the contracts of this corporation shall have been fully liquidated. In case of the death of either of said commissioners, the survivor shall continue to act.

ARTICLE VII - No stockholder of this corporation shall ever be held liable or responsible for the contracts of this corporation further than the unpaid balance due to the corporation on the shares owned by him, nor shall any mere informality in organization have the effect of rendering this charter null, nor of exposing a stockholder to any liability beyond the amount of his stock.

This done and passed in my notarial office at New Orleans aforesaid, in the presence of John H. Van Hossen, Harry J. Van Hossen, and William Renaudin, competent witnesses of lawful age and residing in this city, who hereto subscribed their names together with said parties and me, notary, on the day and date set forth in the caption hereof.

AMENDMENT TO CHARTER OF CRESCENT RIVER PORT PILOTS ASSOCIATION.

UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, STATE OF LOUISIANA, PARISH OF ORLEANS, CITY OF NEW ORLEANS.

Be it known that on this twelfth day of the month of May, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, and of the independence of the United States of America the one hundred and thirty-seventh, before me, Charles Joseph Theard, a notary public, duly commissioned, sworn and qualified in and for the parish of Orleans, and in the presence of the witnesses hereinafter named and undersigned, personally came and appeared: Mr. Joseph P. Loga, vice-president, and Mr. William T. Spence, Jr., secretary, of the Crescent River Port Pilots' Association, a corporation organized under the laws of this state, by act passed August 6, 1908, before me, duly commissioned and qualified in this city, and duly recorded in the mortgage office of this parish, in book 912, folio 314.

And the said officers declared that, in accordance with a resolution adopted by the board of directors of the corporation on December 20, 1912, and after the notices and publications required by law, a meeting of the stockholders of the corporation was held in this city on February 11, 1913, to decrease the capital stock of said corporation from \$300,000 to \$250,000, and for other purposes.

That, at said meeting, the capital stock was reduced from \$300,000 to \$250,000, and the number of shares from five hundred to four hundred shares, and the same was approved by a majority of the stockholders of the corporation, and the same was duly recorded in the mortgage office of this parish, in book 912, folio 314.

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
