

April 6, 1914. AMENDMENT OF THE CHARTER OF THE ORLEANS INVESTMENT COMPANY.

United States of America, State of Louisiana, Parish of Orleans. Be it known that on this sixth day of the month of April, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, and of the independence of the United States of America, the one hundred and thirty-eighth, before me, William J. Formento, a notary public, duly sworn, and qualified in and for the parish of Orleans, state of Louisiana, therein residing, and in the presence of the witnesses hereinafter named and designated, personally came and appeared: Messrs. Albert L. Stewart and Edwin F. Muller, both of the age of majority and sane in their respective capacities as president and secretary of the Orleans Investment Company, a corporation duly incorporated, by act before William J. Formento, notary public, for the parish of Orleans, Louisiana, on January 5th, 1914, and duly recorded in the mortgage book No. 119, folio No. 383, and domiciled in the city of New Orleans; the said president and secretary appearing herein under the name of the said corporation, and by virtue of a resolution adopted by the stockholders of the said company, at a meeting held on the sixth day of April, 1914, a certified copy of the extracts of the minutes of the said meeting being hereto annexed and made part hereof.
