CHARTER

OF MARKSVILLE ELECTRIC LIGHT & ICE CO., INC.

State of Louisiana, Parish of Orleans, City

of New Orleans.

Be it known that on this 28th day of

the month of August, in the year nineteen

hundred and fourteen, before me, Scott E. Beer,

a notary public in and for the parish of Or-

leans, state of Louisiana, therein residing,

dually sworn, commissioned and qualified,

and in the presence of the witnesses hereinafter

named and undersigned, personally came and

appeared, the parties whose names are hereinafter

subscribed, who declared that they were

availing themselves of the laws of the state of

Louisiana in such cases made and provided,

they have agreed and contracted, and

generally to execute, for all the purposes

for which it is incorporated, or connected

therewith or incidental thereto, all the powers

vested in such corporations by the laws of

this state.

Article I.—The name of this corporation

shall be the Marksville Electric Light & Ice

Company, Inc., under which corporation it

shall have corporate existence and suc-

cession for the term of ninety-nine years from

the date hereof, and its name shall be

power to sue and be sued, to contract, to

purchase, lease, mortgage, pledge, alienate

and encumber real estate, personal property

and generally to execute, for all the purposes

for which it is incorporated, or connected

therewith or incidental thereto, all the powers

vested in such corporations by the laws of

this state.

Article II.—The objects and purposes for

which this corporation is organized and the

nature of the business to be carried on by it

are set forth as follows, to-wit:

To manufacture and sell electric current

and power and ice, and to have and sell all

things connected with the said business, as

well as to do construction work covering

the electric business, and generally to do any

and all things and acts connected with the

said business above named or incidental or

related thereto.

Article III.—The capital stock of this cor-

poration shall be ten thousand dollars (\$10,-

000.00), to be represented by one hundred

shares (\$100 each) which said shares of stock

shall be full paid and non-assessable, and

shall be paid for in cash, property or labor,

as determined and received by the directors

all in accordance with the laws of this state.

All transfers of stock shall be made on the

books of this corporation, subject to the rules

and regulations to be determined on by the

board of directors thereof. In accordance with

the law of this state, this corporation shall

be authorized to do business as soon as five

thousand dollars of its capital stock has been

subscribed and the balance of the capital stock

has been actually paid in cash or property,

as provided in the law governing corporations

in this state. The board of directors shall

prescribe the rules covering the election

and duties of the officers and directors of this

corporation, but the officers then in office shall

hold their offices until their successors are

elected and qualified.

The first board of directors of this corpora-

tion, with their respective offices and ad-

dresses, are as follows: Edwin M. Kur-

sheed, 518 Whitney Bank Bldg., New Or-

leans, La., secretary and treasurer; James

R. Black, 88 Hebert Bldg., New Orleans, La.,

vice-president; Rush Price Strong, Lou-

isiana Fire Prevention Bureau, New Orleans,

president. Subsequent boards of directors,

when elected, shall, at once after their

election, choose from their number a presi-

dent, a vice-president and a secretary-tre-

asurer.

All directors may act by proxy, in writing,

which proxy, in writing, shall allow the holder

thereof, to act in all respects the same as if

the shareholder signing same were present

acting in person.

Article VI.—This charter may be amended

by complying with all the rules and regu-

lations and laws made to cover amendments to

corporations, as provided in act 227 of 1914

state of Louisiana, Sec. 4.

Article VII.—Whenever, in the judgment

of the board of directors of this corporation,

it shall be deemed advisable to dissolve or li-

quidate this corporation, all steps provided in

Section 28 of the Act No. 227 of 1914, state of

Louisiana, shall be complied with, unless, as

provided in said article, all stockholders con-

sent, without other formalities.

Whenever the corporation shall be dissolved

either by limitation, or otherwise, as above

provided, the directors shall, at the meeting

for the liquidation and dissolution of the cor-

poration, two liquidators shall be named, who

shall remain in office until the affairs of the

corporation shall have been fully liquidated

and settled. In case of the death of either

of them, the survivor shall act as such li-

quidator. Article VIII.—No stockholder in this

corporation shall ever be liable or responsible

for the debts or contracts of this corporation

in any further sum than the unpaid balance

due by him on his stock subscription; nor

shall any informality in the organization of

this company have the effect of rendering this

charter null or of exposing the stockholders

to any liability beyond that above stipulated
