MR. HOTARD GETS CONTRACT.

The new levee work between the upper end of the Morcan wharf at Gretna to a point near the Texas and Pacific property in McDonoghville is under way. Contractor Theo. O. Hotard of Algiers having the contract. In some places the new levee will be five feet higher than at present, reaching a height of 12 feet. The base will be 90 feet and the crown 10 feet. The contract calls for about 90,000 cubic feet of earth at 24 1/2 cents per cubic foot. A portion of the land near the old Richard street ferry landing, including several homes, will be outside of the new levee, the engineers having changed the lines at this point.
