CHARTER OF THE CRESCENT PRINTING COMPANY, INCORPORATED.

United States of America, State of Louisiana, Parish of Orleans, City of New Orleans.

Be it known, that on this first day of the month of December, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and sixteen (1916) and of the independence of the United States of America, the one hundred and forty-first, before me, Allan Raymond Beary, a notary public in and for the parish and state aforesaid, duly commissioned, sworn and qualified, therein residing, and in the presence of the witnesses hereinafter named and undersigned, personally came and appeared the several persons whose names are hereinafter subscribed, all above the age of majority, who severally declared that, availing themselves of the provisions of the laws of this state relative to the organization of corporations, and in pursuance of the Acts of the General Assembly of the State of Louisiana, approved July 9, 1914, they have consented, agreed and bind, by these presents, to incorporate and constitute a corporation in law for the objects and purposes, and under the agreements and stipulations following, to-wit:

Article I.—The name and title of this corporation shall be Crescent Printing Company, Incorporated, and under its said corporate name it shall have power and authority to have and enjoy, under and in pursuance of the full term and period of ninety (90) nine years from and after the date hereof; to contract and be bound, to make and use a corporate seal, if desired, and the same to break or alter at pleasure; to hold, receive, lease, purchase or acquire, in fee simple, mortgage and hypothecate property, real, personal and mixed, corporeal and incorporeal; to name and appoint such managers, agents, directors and officers as it may see fit; to make and establish, as well as alter and amend, its by-laws, rules and regulations for the government of the affairs of said corporation as may be necessary and proper.

Article II.—The domicile of said corporation shall be in the city of New Orleans, Parish of Orleans, State of Louisiana, and all citations, notices, legal process, shall be served upon the president, or in his absence, upon the vice-president, and, in the event of the absence of both of said officers, as the law directs.

Article III.—The objects and purposes for which this corporation is formed and the nature of the business to be conducted by it, are hereby declared to be: Typesetting, machine composition, stereotyping, lithography, engraving, printing, bookbinding and ruling, and to buy, sell, lease, mortgage and all kinds of presses, type, paper and any and all accessories appertaining thereto.

Article IV.—The authorized capital stock of this corporation shall be divided into five thousand (\$5,000) dollars, to be divided into 50,000 shares of the par value of twenty (\$25) five dollars each, and the amount to which the said capital stock of this corporation may be increased by the board of directors, as provided by law.

Article V.—All of the corporate powers of this corporation shall be vested in and exercised by a board of directors to be composed of three stockholders, two of whom shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. The board of directors shall elect, annually, from their number, a president, a vice-president and a secretary-treasurer. The board of directors, from time to time, such officers, agents, clerks and employees as they may deem necessary for the purposes and objects of this corporation, who shall hold office at the pleasure of the board, or may appoint a manager or other person to manage the business and discharge such agents or employees as may be necessary. Said board may make, alter and amend any and all by-laws and regulations proper for the conduct of the business of the corporation.

Article VI.—This charter may be modified, changed or amended, or said corporation may be dissolved, with the assent of stockholders owning two-thirds of the entire capital stock of this corporation, as determined at a meeting of the stockholders convened for that purpose, after fifteen days' notice in writing shall have been given to each stockholder, mailed to his last known address.

In case of liquidation, the board of directors shall be liquidators. Stockholders may vote either in person or by proxy. No stockholder shall ever be held liable or responsible for the contracts or debts of this corporation in any further sum than the unpaid balance due the corporation on the shares of stock owned by him, and no personal liability in organization have the effect of rendering this charter null, or of exposing any stockholder to any liability beyond the balance due by him.

Article VII.—The subscribers hereto have, respectively, written opposite their names the amount of stock in this corporation subscribed for by each of them, so that this act of incorporation shall serve as the original subscription list of said corporation.

Article VIII.—This corporation having been formed to business, goods, and will and plant of the co-partnership existing between Alfred B. and J. L. Robert, under the name of the "Crescent Printing Company," the said Alfred B. and J. L. Robert have turned over to this corporation in payment of their subscriptions to the capital stock of this corporation the entire equipment and assets of said Crescent Printing Company, consisting of one 7x11 Platen press, with electric motor and appurtenances; one 10x15 Platen press, with electric motor and appurtenances; one 14x22 Platen press with electric motor and appurtenances; seventy cases with about 750 pounds of type; one Boston 3/4 inch stapler; one iron safe; all office furniture and fixtures; stock of paper on hand; unfinished jobs on hand and the house to date; one push cart, and all other appurtenances and accessories pertaining to typesetting and printing in general; as well as all the accounts due and owing to said co-partnership, and this corporation assumes all obligations of said co-partnership.

Article VII.—The period of duration of this corporation shall be the full term and period of twenty-five (25) years from the date hereof.

Article VIII.—The business and affairs of this corporation shall be conducted by, and all the corporate powers of this corporation shall be vested in and exercised by a board of directors consisting of three (3) stockholders to be elected annually by the stockholders on the first Monday of December in each year and every year, commencing with the year 1917.

At the first meeting of the board following each election, the board of directors then elected shall elect one of their number to be the president, one to be the vice-president, and one to be the secretary-treasurer of this corporation.

The following named persons shall constitute the first board of directors of this corporation, to-wit: James J. Bell, No. 209 Dumaine street, city; Martin Duralle Claiborne, No. 103 Second street, city; and Roger Arnaud, No. 103 Second street, city, and Mr. James J. Bell shall be president, Mr. Roger Arnaud shall be vice-president and Mr. Martin Duralle Claiborne shall be secretary-treasurer of this corporation; and they shall all serve until the first Monday in December, 1917, or until their successors shall have been duly elected and qualified.
