ALGIERS BOYS WHO GO BENEFIT FOR ITALIAN RED CROSS

The Honor List of the First Draft

Seven Hundred Six Men Called in the Thirteenth District of Which Algiers is Part. Three Hundred Fifty-three to be Selected.

Today, Friday and Saturday are the three days set aside for examination and reporting for duty. The following are the names and addresses of the Algiers boys who have had the honor to be drawn first for service to their country. Seven hundred and six names, representing the first quota for this district, have been drawn and out of this seven hundred and six names it is estimated that three hundred and fifty-three will be accepted.

If this first seven hundred and six names that have been drawn is not sufficient to fill the quota for the thirteenth exemption district, then other names will be taken out of the list as they appear in order. For instance, should there be lacking ten or fifteen names after the first examination, thirty or forty more names will be drawn and from this number will be selected a sufficient amount to fill the quota for this district, namely, three hundred and fifty-three.

Notices are now being prepared and the first will be sent out today, tomorrow and Saturday, when examinations will take place.

It is estimated at the office of the thirteenth exemption district that it will require about three days to examine the seven hundred and six men and they are taking a third to each day.

Many of the young men whose names appear on this list will be exempted for many reasons. Some will be rejected after physical examination, some will be exempt on account of marital status, while others may be left at home to take care of aged parents and minor children.


