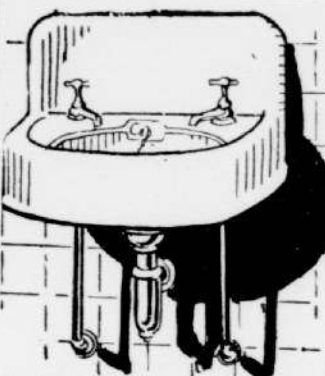

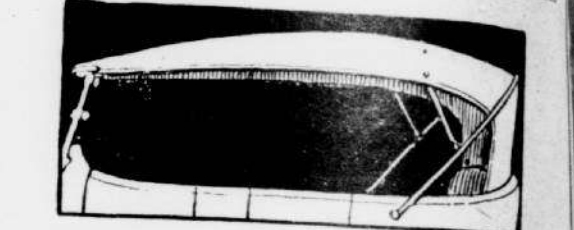

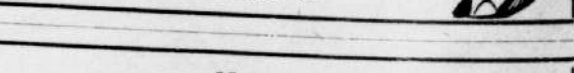

A movement is spreading throughout the West among the Farm Bureaus to extend their influence as sources of education and not to confine themselves to encouraging better agriculture alone. Enterprising county agents see the need of interesting the younger generation of the farm in other things besides farming and thus offset the lure of the city.

The latest idea hails from Ft. Worth, Texas, where H. M. Means, county agent, is revolutionizing things by means of a specially equipped motor truck. It carries an electric light plant, motion picture machine, phonograph, with a liberal supply of records and a traveling library. They touch on all phases of education and entertaining too.

The educational truck makes nightly visits to rural schools, where children of all ages and their parents listen to musical programs, see motion pictures of real value, and get books from the library on a regular card system.
