SAVORY SUMMER DISHES.

Gather some fresh mushrooms in field or pasture; peel the caps and cut the stems into small pieces; cook in a little butter until thoroughly done; add cream or add to a rich cream sauce and serve as a vegetable in timbal cases or on toast.

Beefsteak Smothered in Mushrooms.

The mushrooms carefully cleaned, with caps peeled, cut in bits and put into a pan with a tablespoonful of butter for each cupful of mushrooms, and bake 40 minutes. Broil steak until nearly done, then put into the pan with the mushrooms; cover with some and cook a few moments. Serve with the mushrooms over the steak.

Veal Loaf.

Boil a pound of lean veal in water to cover. When done, remove the meat and simmer the stock until reduced to one-half cupful. To this add salt, celery salt, grated lemon peel, the juice of half a lemon, the chopped veal and a tablespoonful of chopped ham. Place in a mold and press under a weight. Turn out the next day and slice. Garnish with lemon and parsley.

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CHARTER.

ARTICLE V. No stockholder may sell, assign or transfer his stock in this corporation without giving to the other stockholders, through the Secretary, Treasurer of this corporation, notice in writing of such intention, and the other stockholders shall have the right for a period of thirty days from the delivery of such notice to the Secretary-Treasurer to purchase all or any part of the stock of such stockholder for cash at the book value thereof, after which thirty days the said stock may be sold without restriction.

CHARTER.

ARTICLE VI. All the corporate powers of this corporation shall be vested in and exercised by a board of three (3) directors, each of whom shall hold in his own name at least one share of the stock of this corporation at his last designated address, or care of general delivery at Montgomery, Alabama, or at the address specified in a notice stating the time and place of the meeting. Each shareholder shall be entitled to one vote on the books of this corporation, to be cast in person or by proxy, and a majority of the votes cast shall elect a director.

CHARTER.

ARTICLE VII. At its first meeting, each board of directors shall elect from its members a president, a vice-president, and a secretary-treasurer, and shall from time to time as it sees fit, appoint or employ such other officers and agents as may be necessary. The board of directors shall have full power and authority to fix the salaries of all officers and of all such other agents, and to make and establish, as well as to alter and amend all by-laws, rules and regulations necessary for the proper management of this corporation not inconsistent with the Constitution and the laws of the State of Louisiana for the year 1914, and the amendments thereto.

CHARTER.

ARTICLE VIII. The objects and purposes for which this corporation is formed and the nature of the business to be carried on by it are hereby declared to be: To buy, sell, import, export, manufacture and generally to deal, wholesale and retail, in all kinds of merchandise without limitation, but especially in shoes, slippers, boots and all kinds of footwear and articles of clothing, and generally to carry on any other business, which under the law it may be entitled to carry on, whether directly or indirectly, to effect the foregoing objects and purposes, or either of them, or to facilitate the carrying on of the transaction of its aforesaid business or businesses or any part thereof, or in the transaction of any other lawful business that may be calculated to directly or indirectly enhance the value of, or to render profitable any of the corporation's property and rights, and generally to hold and exercise all such incidental powers and privileges and to do and perform all things as relate to the objects and purposes hereinabove set forth, or as may be deemed, necessary, proper and expedient for the carrying on of the objects and purposes, or either of them.

CHARTER.

ARTICLE IX. Until contrary action by the Board of Directors, the President shall have charge of all of the business of the corporation, and shall have authority to enter into all kinds of contracts of sale, purchase or lease, on such terms and conditions as he may see fit, and also to draw out by check, signed by him in the name of this corporation any and all funds deposited in any bank to the credit of this corporation.

CHARTER.

ARTICLE X. This charter may be amended and the capital stock of this corporation may be increased or decreased, or this charter may be dissolved and the liquidation of its affairs provided for.

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ARTICLE XI.
