 Mr. and Mrs. E. A. Pellerin spent the holidays with friends and relatives in New Orleans.


Some Potato Sale.

 Mrs. S. E. Elias, of Columbia St spent Xmas with relatives and friends in New Orleans.


Next Council Meeting.


