PRESIDENT AGAIN PREDICTS PROSPERITY ERA

Tells Businessmen what He Has Tried To Accomplish.

Another confident prediction that the country soon will enter upon a new era of enterprise and prosperity was voiced Friday by President Wilson in a speech before the convention of the American Electric Railway Association at Washington.

Speaking to business men and through them to the world of business generally, the President outlined what the Democratic Congress has tried to accomplish through its trust legislation, and declared that while a test period would be required to determine whether the correct remedy had been applied, he believed the "maze of interrogation points" which had checked enterprise for twenty years, had been cleared away. With a common understanding regarding business reached, he said henceforth nobody is going to be suspicious of any business just because it is big. He gave some of the "rules of the game" which he thought ought to be followed, heading the list which publicity—"not doing anything under cover."
