**RAILWAYS SAY**

**LAW IS BURDEN**

**Data At Wage Inquiry Showing 3,459 Regulations Added, Thereby Reducing Income.**

Statistics showing that in the last four years western railroads have been made subject to 3,459 orders and laws by commissions, municipalities and state legislatures were presented to the board of arbitration in the wage hearing at Chicago Saturday.

"They cover every subject, from drinking cups to weeding the right of way," declared Warren S. Stone of council for the engineers, after glancing down the list presented by the railways to show the burdens to which they are subjected.

James M. Sheean, attorney for the railroads, explained that it was impossible to estimate in money the cost of these regulations to the roads, but they were presented for the purpose of giving the board "a complete picture" of the burdens on railroad incomes, and to show in addition that the railroad employees in certain instances, while asking for more money for increased efficiency, were supporting prospective laws which would curtail that efficiency.

**DIVIDENDS CUT IN WEST.**

He cited a bill before the legislature in Utah to curtail the length of trains. This bill, he said, had the support of trainmen.

Touching on the financial condition of the roads, J. H. Keefe, assistant general manager of the Gulf, Colorado & Santa Fe Railroad, testified that interest on the funded debt of the Western roads had increased \$27,000,000 since 1910. Despite the increased mileage operated, he stated that the aggregate dividends of 1914 were \$22,000,000 less than in 1910. The aggregate surplus, he said, decreased \$24,000,000. Income from sources other than operation alone increased.
