### FOUND THE MODEL HUSBAND; READ WHAT HE ACCOMPLISHED

An exhausted definition of "model young husband" is given in the divorce petition of Edward K. Fischer against Catherine E. Fischer, filed in Circuit Court at St. Joseph Mo. The plaintiff says he is the subject of the definition. Here are some of the points upon which Fischer bases his claim:

Before his marriage, while earning \$50 a month as a railway clerk, he saved \$600.

In the eight years of his married life he has not lost an hour from the office.

Almost immediately after his marriage his pay was advanced to \$60, his present salary.

He owns his home, paid for from his savings.

He is the father of four children, the youngest 1 year old. While his children were babies he arose every two hours during the night to prepare their bottles for them.

He undresses the children each night and puts them to bed.

He arose regularly at 4 o'clock every Monday morning and did the family washing before going to the office.

He assisted in doing the dishes three or four times a week.

Working mornings and evenings, he made garden and raised chickens.

Every month he gave his pay check to his wife, and she gave him 25 cents spending money, which lasted him two weeks.

To save car fare he habitually walked between his home and his place of employment, a distance of two miles.

In the entire eight years of his married life he has been away from his family not to exceed nine or ten evenings, but has attended entertainments with his wife during that period.

He has sent his wife on two trips to San Francisco one trip to Buffalo one trip to St. Louis, one trip to Chicago and numerous trips to Omaha.

He has only one weakness. That is baseball.

### LUMBER MEN ARE OPTIMISTIC CONDITIONS ARE IMPROVING

Reports from mills in the Ozone Belt indicates that inquiries and orders are being received in an increasing volume, and all the operators are of the opinion that recent advances cannot be maintained, but that further advances in prices will be secured within the next thirty to forty five days.

Car material, dimension and Common Boards are still in the greatest demand, and other items of Yard and Shed stocks are moving in better volume than they were twenty to thirty days ago. The timber market also is strengthening, with very satisfactory volume of orders on file at practically all of the mills. The Great Southern Lumber Company of Bogalusa are making heavy shipments and report orders, at better prices, are being secured in a satisfactory volume.

The shipments for July, in the Yellow Pine producing territory, far exceeded those of any month of the year 1915, which resulted in a substantial reduction of the stocks on hand. With this reduction, and the assurance of an increase in demand for lumber during the remainder of the year on account of the bumper crops throughout the country, which are now practically assured, and the increasing wealth due to the excess of exports, the saw-mill operators of this district are in a most optimistic frame of mind.

Wilson Here Sep. 4th.

Harry D. Wilson, candidate for the office of Commissioner of Agriculture will make an address in Bogalusa on Saturday Sept 4. Mr. Wilson will give the farmers some good advice and indications are that he will be greeted by a large crowd.

### AGAIN PROTESTS AGAINST OPENING NEAR BEER SALOONS

Franklinton, La., Aug 19—The persons who undertook to establish a near beer saloon in the town here and were dissuaded from doing so by the citizens calling on them, started the construction of a building just across the Bogue Chitto river from town, which is in the First Ward, and yesterday a mass meeting was called by the citizens of this ward to protest against the establishment of the saloon. More than a hundred persons attended the meeting.

Andrew Ficke, Jr., acted as president and Arthur D Metz as secretary of the meeting and a committee was appointed to call upon the near beer saloon promoters with the idea of getting them to abandon their project.

It seems that the citizens are determined to forestall the establishment of any near beer saloons in this part of the parish. They take the position that such an enterprise aids nothing to business and is a constant menace to the morals of the community.

President Dewitt E Branch and Secretary C Doremus are busily engaged in circulating the catalogue and premium list of the Washington Parish Fair, which is scheduled to take place here October 14 to 16.

Saturday the last day of the fair, has been designated as State Candidates' Day, and every state candidate will be invited to make an address to the voters assembled here that day.

### LIBERAL PRIZES OFFERED AT THE FAIRS TO BOYS AND GIRLS

Cash prizes to the amount of nearly \$2,000.00 will be offered at the State Fair this fall to members of the boys' and girls' industrial clubs and students of the agricultural and domestic science schools who make exhibits and who take part in the corn and live stock judging contests. Two silver loving cups will also be given to the judging teams (consisting of three boys from a school) who make the highest score in the judging contests.

In addition to the foregoing prizes there will be awarded more than one hundred scholarships to the Winter Short Course at the Louisiana State University to club members on their records in club work and their exhibits at the State Fair.

Practically all the parish fairs, of which there will be twenty-eight in 1915, offer liberal prizes and premiums to club members who make exhibits.
