FREDDY GETS 20 YEARS JONES LIFE SENTENCE

Criminal Court Adjourns At Franklinton After A Busy Session

J. H. Freddy, who was arrested by the local police department several months ago charged with one of the most fiendish crimes ever committed in the Parish, was found guilty of incest and sentenced to 20 years in the state prison at the session of the Criminal court last week. Freddy stated that he was charged with a similar offense while a resident of Mississippi. His daughter and son were the principal witnesses against him. When the police made the arrest the two sons were defending the father and only a clever piece of work on the part of the local authorities was responsible for the arrest without bloodshed.

The other cases disposed of at this term of court were as follows:

Bob Sam, three years, and John Foster, five years, stealing cattle; John O'Neal, three years, burglarly; Doza Hodge, two years, stealing a bicycle; James Clifford, two years, grand larceny; Sam Jones, life sentence, for murder; Bessie Robertson, three years, cutting with intent to kill.

STATE ATHLETIC CONTEST WILL BE HELD THIS YEAR

Baton Rouge, Nov. 12.—To encourage a more general physical development of students attending public schools, C. A. Ives, state high school inspector, announced Tuesday that athletic tests again will be held this year and that silver and bronze pins will be awarded to all pupils who make the required standard.

The athletic test plan was first tried out by Mr. Ives last year and thousands of school children took part. The plan has this year been extended so as to include girls as well as boys, and the elementary as well as the high school grades. The tests are not competitive, but conditional, and all who come up to the requirements will be awarded a prize. Mr. Ives hopes to have most of the boys and girls of the state try out in the events and gain the benefit of the wholesome exercise afforded.

Tests will be held twice during the season, the first period closing December 15, and the second period from February 1 to May 1.

GROW PECANS, IS THE ADVICE OF EXPERTS'

Vast Sums Sent Abroad For Nuts: Home Production Small

Nearly \$20,000,000 was sent abroad for nuts last year, local followers of the industry say, and as a means of cutting down this enormous demand for imported nuts Louisianians are urged to plant pecan trees on their lawns. The home production of nuts last year was less than \$5,000,000 in value.

Pecan trees, little known outside the pecan experts say, and one tree will produce enough to pay for the up-keep of a city lot. In addition to being profitable the pecan tree is one of Louisiana's most ornamental trees. It is an excellent shade tree.

Abroad the pecan is practically unknown and in America, it is estimated, less than five per cent of the people know pecan nuts. This is largely due to the fact that the supply has never been large and the distribution has not been as thorough as it would have been if the industry were on a more extensive scale.

Pecans are indigenous to this country and to the South especially. Paper shell pecans are one of the star products of Louisiana and are gradually coming to be known as well as Florida's oranges and California grapes.

In fourteen years the imports of nuts increased from \$2,973,834 to \$19,728,924 in value. No pecans are imported.

NEAR-BEER LAW WILL GO TO HIGHEST COURT

Lake Charles, La. Nov. 11 District Attorney Edwards has appealed the case of V. V. Waler, prosecuted under the near-beer law in the district court to the supreme court. Waler was charged with selling near-beer in unlabeled bottles. The court held that it was necessary to conviction to show by chemical analysis that the ingredients were contrary to law. If this decision is upheld, the usefulness of the near-beer law will be seriously impaired.
