## WANT PER CAPITA TAX REDUCED? ATTEND MEET

### If Enough Are Present To Protest Council Will Make It \$3

There is considerable talk among the citizens of Bogalusa who have to pay \$5 per capita tax as voted and recommended by the recent Mass meeting, as to whether it would not be better to collect a smaller amount this year and commence work on the streets gradually.

After discussing the matter with Mayor Sullivan, it has been suggested that if a sufficient number of citizens interested in the subject would attend the regular meeting of the Commission Council on the first Tuesday in March, the Commission Council would be very glad to consider whether the tax should be \$5 or \$3. The Mayor suggested that it might be a good plan to reduce it to 3 dollars and have it payable 1 dollar on the first of April, 1 dollar on the first of May and 1 dollar on the first of June, and in the ordinance recommend that every one who feels able to do so, pay 5 dollars per year instead of 3 dollars. There are many of our citizens who are using the streets and who, we have no doubt, would be very glad to pay 5 dollars.

It is the desire of the Commission Council to have all these matters satisfactory to the citizens in general, and it is especially requested that if there are any citizens of the city who feel that it would be better to levy 3 dollar per capita tax than to levy a 5 dollar tax, that they attend the meeting of the Council on the first Tuesday of March or write a letter to the Mayor sometime before that date, giving their views on the subject.

## TWO MILLION A DAY WE'RE SENDING AWAY

### In The Way Of Munitions Of War To European Countries

Washington, Feb. 21.—American-made war munitions now are pouring into Europe at the rate of nearly \$2,000,000 worth daily, with the figures swelling rapidly as the production increases. Estimates made at the department of commerce yesterday put total munitions shipments since Europe began to purchase for the present war close to a quarter of a billion dollars. At the rate shipments are going on the next four months would see this total doubled, even if production remained at a standstill.

A great part of the munitions output has been in the form of high explosive shells, more than one hundred million dollar's worth of which have left American shores. Powder comes next with shipments estimated at nearly one hundred million dollars and small arm cartridges are third with thirty million dollars. Firearms are put at less than twenty million dollars with small increase shown.

## COL. WRIGHT EXPECTED TO ARRIVE FOR VISIT TODAY

Col. Geo. R. Wright, of Chicago, and President of the Louisiana Fibre Board Co., owners of the Million Dollar Paper Mill is expected to arrive in Bogalusa to day to look after his interests and visit his son George and many friends. Col. Wright was the gentleman who organized the company which built the plant here and it was due to his untiring efforts that obstacles were overcome which resulted in the mill being started. Besides getting the paper mill in Bogalusa Col. Wright never misses an opportunity of boosting the Magic City to his friends in the North.

## MISTRIAL RESULTS IN WINE OF CARDUI VS DR. DOWLING

According to a telegram received at the office of the State Board of Health Monday a mistrial was declared in the suit of the Chattanooga Medicine Co., against Dr. Oscar Dowling, president of the board. The telegram from the chief of the state health board stated that two of the jurymen being ill the judge had declared a mistrial.

The suit for \$25,000 damages was brought by the medicine company against Dr. Dowling because of his having had on exhibiting on the health train, among other exhibits, "Wine of Cardui," which he designated as "a nostrum." The suit for damages was brought in the Federal court at Chattanooga.—Daily States,

## USE GUNS TO SEAT SHERIFF IN OFFICE

### Martial Law Is Declared In Clarksdale, Miss.—Feeling Runs High

Clarksdale, Miss., Feb. 7.—State troops late tonight took possession of the Coahoma county courthouse here and installed in office L. A. Fisher, who was named by Gov. Theodore Bilbo to succeed J. D. Baugh as sheriff.

The troops battered down a door to the courthouse to gain entrance, but no resistance was offered and, while factional feeling is intense, no

disorder had occurred up to midnight.

Tonight's action was taken after Baugh's refusal to accede to a proclamation issued by Gov. Bilbo declaring his office vacant because of alleged shortage in his settlement with the state at the end of a previous term.

Baugh has refused to give up the office and has asked the Supreme Court for an injunction restraining Fisher from superceding him until the question of his eligibility can be passed upon. The Supreme Court has not yet announced its decision.

In the meantime Fisher will attempt to perform the duties of the office under the protection of the National Guard on the governor's orders. At the August primaries Fisher was a candidate against Baugh for the Democratic nomination for sheriff, but was defeated by him by a decided majority, and in the general election in November, Baugh was elected without opposition.
