COLUMBIA ST. MERCHANTS FAVOR SUNDAY PICTURES

Some Favor Stores Closing Others Want Them Open

Every merchant along Columbia Street is in favor of Sunday baseball and picture shows on Sunday evening, but they are divided as to whether the stores should remain closed or not. Some favor closing all stores, others favor serving patrons who can buy only on Sunday, others want the front doors locked and others want the front doors closed. Anyway they all agree that the stopping of Sunday baseball and motion pictures would deprive the citizens of what little amusement there is in this city on Sunday.

Dr. Joseph, of Joseph & Levy, favors closing the stores on Sunday. He is in favor of Sunday baseball and moving pictures. H. Greenberg favors conditions in the future as in the past, but thinks the doors of all stores should be closed on Sunday. E. A. Quick, of the Model shoe store is in favor of Sunday baseball and motion pictures, but thinks the stores ought to remain closed. B. E. Bagley favors motion pictures, Sunday baseball and the closing of the front doors. Strug brothers favor both amusements, but thinks all stores should at least close their front doors on Sunday. The Williams Drug Co., favor conditions as they were until last week. Mrs. W. G. Henry says it is ridiculous to stop the picture shows and baseball but favors a closing of the stores, if a majority want it. M. Hyman favors the closing of stores but wants Sunday baseball and pictures. M. Marx thinks that all front doors of stores should be closed on Sunday but that the picture show should be permitted to run. Harry, the tailor, favors pictures and whatever is decided upon regarding Sunday closing will be satisfactory to him. Chas. Warnick, of the Grand, wants the picture shows to operate, but thinks that all stores should close at noon on Sunday. Meyer Berenson, of Berenson Bros., wants picture shows and stores to remain open but front door closed. D. Bienn wants Sunday picture shows and the closing is not worrying him as he never keeps open on Sunday. Frank Lusco, who conducts a grocery and market, favors open Sunday as he has a big trade in fruit and oysters and Sunday closing causes him a loss of fruit and vegetables. S. Elias, of Uncle Sam's Department Store, favors amusement for all and the keeping of front doors closed. A. W. Marth, of the United Store favors picture and baseball but thinks the stores should be closed on Sunday.

H. H. Wilcox, of the Bogalusa Mercantile Co., was not at his place of business when a reporter called, but it is stated that he favors the closing of stores, but thinks we ought to have another ball park and a picture show for Sunday amusement.

CLASS OF 300 TO BE INITIATED EASTER DAY

When Fourth Degree Will Be Given Knights of Columbus.

Archbishop Blenk and Supreme Knight J. A. Flaherty will attend the Easter exomplification of the Knights of Columbus here April 23 and 24, at which over 300 candidates will receive the fourth degree. The ceremonies will bring out a great conclave of local and visiting fourth degree knights, bishops and prelates of the province. Easter Monday night, April 24, a grand reception will be tendered the knights, which will be attended by prominent men of the clergy and laity, together with a great number of ladies. It will be held in the gold room on the mezzanine floor of the Grunewald Hotel.

All candidates for the fourth degree must meet the following requirements: They must be 21 years old and citizens of the United States, in good financial standing in their council and the order and otherwise in general good standing; they are required to present credentials from their spiritual advisors or pastors to the effect that they possess practical Catholicity and have received holy communion within two weeks prior to the date of initiation in this degree, and must have been connected for at least two years with the third degree of the council.—New Orleans American.
