**BE SURE TO VOTE FRIDAY**

**TOMORROW FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 27th**, the qualified voters of the city of Bogalusa will select the members of the Commission Council to serve for the next four years. The primary tomorrow is equivalent to the election and will be the first primary to select the city officers. There are eight candidates seeking the four offices of the Commission Council, and each voter in casting his ballot should support those men whom he consciously thinks are best qualified to hold the important position. Voters should bear in mind that they must vote for four candidates. Failure to do so will make your ballot void.

Owing to the growth and development of Bogalusa the selection of Commissioners is more important than in other cities of this size. Great strides have been made from a municipal standpoint since this city was incorporated, and even greater progress is predicted for Bogalusa during the next four years. The campaign here has been conducted in a clean manner, only on one or two occasions has there been any remarks that would hurt the feelings of any candidate.

The voting places will be the same as where you registered week before last, and where you voted in the Senatorial contest. It is expected that there will be about 500 votes cast in the city, and when you go to the polls to vote, cast your ballot for the candidates you think are best qualified to represent the city.

Dear Friend:

I solicit your vote and your valued support of my candidacy. I fear that owing to the short time at my disposal, I may not have the privilege of seeing you in person to discuss with you my claims to the high honor of representing you in the Commission Council.

I am actively engaged in business. I am also president of the Columbia Road Land Co., which has been unusually successful in upbuilding Bogalusa, and during the last two years I have devoted whatever talent I possess in serving the people in the capacity of chairman of the Sewerage and Water Board. In this brief time our commission has succeeded in furnishing water to nearly every section of the city where white people reside, and we expect to be able within a short time to lay sewer lines to all section where we have reached with water

By reason of my experience in public affairs, I lay claim with due modesty to the qualification a public servant should possess. I realize the tremendous responsibility which rests upon a commissioner, but in the event of my election, I shall be mindful of both that responsibility and the honor the office carries, and I shall work unceasingly to vindicate the judgment of those who consider me qualified to serve the people of Bogalusa.

Your duty as a citizen, is to vote only for a candidate who is qualified to serve you in the capacity of the office he has chosen. Qualification? You cannot judge him by his promises in the future. You can only judge by his past. Don't let yourself be lined up for a certain candidate. Use your own brains. Has the candidate the qualification to fill the office to which he aspires? Examine his past. Was he steady in his habits? Has he the initiation? Has he business and executive ability? All the above you must consider yourself. Memorize every candidate as you know him and cast your ballot for the ones whom you think are the most fit to serve you. What about myself? Have I the qualifications or not? It is for you to judge. If you think I will make good, cast your ballot for me, and if not, leave my name blank, as I will be your friend anyway, and if I cannot serve you in the capacity as a commissioner, I will always be glad to assist the city in any way that my services may be required, as I have lived in Bogalusa since its infancy, have large investments here and consider Bogalusa my permanent home. Even if you do not consider me your choice, do not miss to vote, as it is your patriotic duty, and on Friday, September 27th, I hope to see every qualified voter in Bogalusa at the polls.

It has been reported that I would resign after serving only a short time, but this is without foundation, and I will feel it an honor to serve the full term.

**DOCTORS NOT TO BE FORCED INTO ARMY**

Washington, Sept. 24.—Representatives of the Volunteer Medical Service Corps throughout the country and state committees of the Council of National Defense were notified today that no form of coercion should be used to bring physicians into the army or navy or the Volunteer Medical Service Corps.

In a joint letter Edward P. Davis, president of the Volunteer Medical Service Corps, and Franklin Martin, chairman of the General Medical Board, Council of National Defense, urged committeemen to favor no movement that would impair a medical man's standing in his local, state or national society because of his refusal to enroll and pointed out that "patriotism cannot be created by coercion."

**Assaults Baby, Is Lynched**

Waycross, Ga., Sept. 24.—Sandy Reeves, a 17-year-old negro, charged with assaulting a 3-year-old white girl near Blackshear, was taken from the arresting officers who were bringing him to Waycross and lynched early today. The body was found this morning hanging to a tree on the Way Cross-Blackshear road.

**NOTARIAL ACT. PARISH OF WASHINGTON, State of Louisiana**

BE IT KNOWN, that on this 16th day of September, A. D. 1918, before, Clarence L. Johnson, a notary public in and for the Parish of Washington, State of Louisiana, and in the presence of the undersigned witnesses, personally came and appeared W. H. Sullivan and M. L. Wuescher, respectively chairman and secretary of the meeting of the stockholders of Bogalusa Paper Company, Inc., held on the 16th day of September, 1918, who declare:

THAT, at a meeting of the stockholders of Bogalusa Paper Company, Inc., a corporation organized under the laws of the State of Louisiana, and domiciled at Bogalusa, Washington Parish, Louisiana, which meeting was held at the office of the company on the 16th day of September, 1918, and which was duly called and held as provided by law, for the purpose of deciding upon the proposal to increase the capital stock of said company from the sum of One Million, Two Hundred Thousand (\$1,200,000) Dollars, to the sum of One Million, Five Hundred Thousand (\$1,500,000) Dollars, and at which meeting all of the stockholders were present, or duly represented by legal proxy, it was decided by unanimous vote of all the stockholders that the Capital Stock of said corporation be increased from the sum of One Million, Two Hundred Thousand (\$1,200,000) Dollars to the sum of One Million, Five Hundred Thousand (\$1,500,000) Dollars, represented by 15,000 shares of the par value of \$100.00 each, and that the charter was amended accordingly.

The said appearers declare that they were authorized and instructed by said meeting of stockholders of said corporation to make this Notarial Act and declaration of such amendment of the charter and increase of the Capital Stock of said company from the sum of One Million, Two Hundred Thousand (\$1,200,000) Dollars to the sum of One Million, Five Hundred Thousand (\$1,500,000) Dollars, and they accordingly do hereby so certify and declare:
