### Fight Sweet Potato Weevil at Harvest

Agricultural College, Miss., Dec. 10.—"Fight the sweet potato weevil at harvest time," is the timely message R. W. Harned, entomologist of the Mississippi A. and M. College, and secretary of the State Plant Board, is sending to the farmers of South Mississippi to protect them from this serious menace to the sweet potato crop. This advice is based on the investigations of the workers in South Mississippi who are trying out many ways of eradicating the pest. The following suggestions should be closely observed:

The harvest season is the most important time to fight the sweet potato weevil. It is at this time that we are in position to find the weevils with the least effort. It is to be remembered that the weevils breed in the storehouse and if we allow them to be housed with the potatoes we may expect to feed them during the winter months, and if we keep them out of the bank we prevent them from destroying our stored potatoes and also from infesting seed for next season's crop. If you lose your crop of potatoes you also lose your work, and time, and fertilizer.

The United States Bureau of Entomology and R. W. Harned, state entomologist and executive officer of the State Plant Board, advise the following precautions and steps at harvest time:

Dig potatoes as soon as they are ready.

Hand cull all the potatoes in the field; throw aside all the weevily ones and leave them in the field for the hogs to eat, or cook them up for hog feed. In no case should they be carried from the field, as in that way you spread the weevil to other parts of your farm.

Haul your good potatoes off the infested field to bank or house. Bank or house the potatoes in a well drained place where the weevils will not get to them from the fields.

Go over the field and rake up all

the roots and vines as soon as they are dry and burn them in the field. Weevils often winter-over in the roots and vines that are left in the field.

Turn in the hogs to eat all the sweet potatoes next spring that do not grow sweet potatoes this year.

Be sure to obtain your seed potatoes next spring from farms that have been inspected and found to be free of weevils.
