J. PIERPONT MORGAN DIES IN ROME, ITALY

THE PASSING OF ONE OF THE WORLD'S GREATEST FINANCIERS.

HAS NO EFFECT ON WALL STREET

The End Came Without Suffering, and Lack of Nerve Force and Inability of Body to Take Nourishment Cause of Death.

Rome—J. Pierpont Morgan, the New York financier, died Monday a few minutes after noon. For months his health had been declining but the symptoms became greatly aggravated about a week ago and since Wednesday last he had been in a semi-comatose condition.

The death of Mr. Morgan was not known in Rome until several hours after it occurred, owing to the desire that Mr. Morgan's son, J. Pierpont Morgan, Jr., who is in New York, should first be notified.

The official statement, prepared by Dr. Giuseppe Bastianelli, Dr. M. Allen Starr and Dr. George A. Dixon, the attending physicians, indicates that a gradual general collapse followed a condition of nervous prostration, which prevented digestive organs from performing their functions.

For five days Mr. Morgan received artificial nourishment, but was unable to assimilate the food. As a result he very rapidly lost strength. For many hours prior to his death he was in a condition of semi-coma, which prevented him from recognizing those about him. His end was without suffering.

Mr. Morgan's daughter, Mrs. Herbert L. Satterlee, who has been in constant attendance, was at the deathbed. She held the hand of her father and tried to obtain some sign of recognition. She thought that when the supreme moment came he faintly pressed her hand. Mr. Satterlee and the physicians almost carried the weeping woman out of the room, where friends tried to comfort her.

John Pierpont Morgan's last resting place probably will be in the mausoleum in Cedar Hill cemetery, Hartford, Conn., which he had erected some years ago in memory of his father and mother. When the body of Mr. Morgan reaches New York from Rome it is expected the funeral services will be held in the Cathedral of St. John the Divine, toward the construction of which Mr. Morgan was a large contributor.

When the news of Mr. Morgan's death in Rome reached New York Monday expressions of regret at his passing were heard on every hand. In the financial district the Stock Exchange and the Consolidated Exchange passed resolutions of respect to his memory and flags everywhere were dropped to half-staff.

The immediate effect on the machinery of Wall street of Mr. Morgan's death was comparatively slight. On the Stock Exchange the news from Rome had largely spent its force within fifteen minutes after the opening of the market. Mr. Morgan's illness had prepared the financial district for the end, and every precaution had been taken to guard against a serious break in prices.

To Overhaul Warships. Washington—Four of the battle-ships of the Atlantic fleet, the Utah, Michigan, Nebraska and Ohio, steamed to their home yards Monday for their annual overhauling.

Gets Clerkship in Senate. Hillsboro, Tex.—Captain William A. Fields, a Hillsboro newspaper man, has gone to Washington, where he has been tendered a clerkship in the United States senate.

Fifty Sets of Twins in One Month. Austin, Tex.—There were fifty sets of twins born in the State during February, according to Dr. R. P. Babcock, state register of vital statistics.

Forty-Two Cars of Cattle. Brownsville, Tex.—What is said to be the largest single shipment of cattle ever made from the Brownsville country arrived at Fort Worth Saturday. The consignment consisted of forty-two carloads.

Water Works Plant for Rosebud. Rosebud, Tex.—The citizens of Rosebud are agitating the installation of a modern water works for their town. More than \$40,000 has been subscribed.

Get Equal Rates. Washington—Orders of the Interstate Commerce Commission giving Indiana millers and grain dealers equal rates and milling-in-transit privileges with competitors in Ohio and Kentucky became effective Monday.

RECORD OF WORK WELL DONE

Anti-Tuberculosis Campaign Fruitful of Results for the Good of All Mankind.

Some comparisons showing the progress of the anti-tuberculosis campaign in the last eight years and the present needs of this movement are made by the National Association for the Study and Prevention of Tuberculosis in a brief report of its work recently issued. During the eight years of its work, the national association has assisted in the organization of over 500 state and local anti-tuberculosis societies located in almost every state and territory of the Union. Over 500 hospital and sanatoria have been established, with more than 30,000 beds for consumptives. About 400 dispensaries, with more than 1,000 physicians in attendance and at least 150 open air schools for tuberculous and anemic children, have also been provided. Laws dealing with tuberculosis have been passed in 45 states, and ordinances on this subject have been adopted in over 200 cities and towns. An active field campaign of education against tuberculosis has been carried on in 40 states and territories by means of lectures, exhibits, the press, and the distribution of over 100,000,000 pamphlets on the disease.


