Mr. C. C. Clarke ordered two more pigs for his club this week. The best friend of the farmer of corn at this season is the harrow. Be sure to keep a dust mulch of at least two inches over your corn as these hot suns will evaporate all of the moisture and you will need it later.

A number of farmers in the parish are beginning to murder their corn already with the turning plow. Remember that when you cut those small white roots that you are cutting down your yields. Cultivate shallow and often.

Some of the fellows in Erath went over to Lafayette Sunday to get three more of those Duroc pigs. That makes 13 good ones in the last few weeks.

Kaplan Town Election

The election for the town of Kaplan was held last Tuesday, and C. E. Comeaux was elected chief of police over Mordard Broussard by 23 majority. Mr. Montgomery was elected mayor without opposition. Messrs. Rayo, Rene Broussard and Ovey Broussard were elected councilmen without opposition.

Notice of Dissolution OF THE Stauffer-Godchaux Co.

Abbeville, La., April 3rd, 1916. A special meeting of the stockholders of the Stauffer Godchaux Company, was held this day in the Company's office, in the Town of Abbeville, La., at 11:00 o'clock, a. m., in pursuance of a notice, which was duly published in accordance with the charter of the company.

On motion, duly made and seconded Mr. Robert E. Putnam was elected Chairman, and Mr. Felix J. Samson, Secretary of the meeting.

The following resolution was offered by E. P. Putnam, seconded by Mr. F. J. Samson, namely:

"Whereas, it is deemed advisable for the interests of all concerned that this corporation be dissolved and its affairs liquidated and its surplus assets distributed to the stockholders in accordance with the provisions of the charter.

"Resolved, that this corporation be and the same is hereby dissolved, and the officers of this meeting be and they are hereby empowered and directed to execute such acts and do such things as may be necessary to carry into effect the subject of this resolution.

The resolution was submitted to a vote, and on roll call 488 shares voted in the affirmative, being more than two-thirds in interest of all the stockholders.

The Chairman declared that the resolution having received the necessary affirmative vote of two thirds in interest of all the stockholders, was adopted. The Chairman then announced that in accordance with the charter the election of three commissioners was the next order of business.

Mr. F. C. Stebbins, seconded by Mr. Albert Stauffer, offered the following resolution:

"Resolved, that Messrs. E. P. Putnam, F. J. Samson and Robert Stauffer shall be elected as Liquidating Commissioners, in accordance with Article V of the charter of this corporation, and that said Liquidating Commissioners shall be vested with all the assets of this company, real and personal, and shall remain in office until the affairs of this corporation shall have been fully liquidated.

There being no other names, a vote was taken and resulted in the unanimous adoption of the resolution and the election of Messrs. E. P. Putnam, F. J. Samson and Robert Stauffer. The chairman announced that they had been duly elected.
