The people would have considered it a sinful waste of money to put in modern improvements, such as scientific laboratories, gymnasiums and special vocational courses. Even in the cities when these things were granted, it was usually with the air of humoring a few foolish dreamers.

But how these ideas have changed in the past few years! A good school is a live wire in any community. They would turn almost any other unit in the community and their spirit is a boosting spirit the results are surprising. After graduation the students go their various ways—some to college or professional schools—some to farm or otherwise make their living in other communities. If they go with a spirit to boost their home town when they go to another community to teach. Think of the people they will meet who are perhaps looking for just such a town. And the teachers, what of them? They are constantly changing their positions, and if you have treated them as you should and they see that your town is a live and growing thing they are not going to keep still about it when they go to another community to teach. Neither will they keep still if the opposite condition is true.

CAMPAIGN TO MEAN MUCH IN LOUISIANA

STRONGER SCHOOLS, CHURCHES, HOSPITALS AND ORPHANAGES WILL RESULT FROM DRIVE.

STATE DEVELOPS RAPIDLY

Baptists Hope To Bring Educational and Religious Pace Up To That Maintained Along Industrial Lines.



DR. C. COTTINGHAM, President Louisiana College, Pineville, La.

Pineville, La.—Some of the things which the Baptist 75 Million Campaign will mean for Louisiana are pointed out in an interesting way by Dr. C. Cottingham, president of Louisiana College of this city, as follows:

"Louisiana, one of the newest old states in the Union, although for a while inclined toward the conservatism of the East, has finally adopted the aggressiveness of the West, and hence forth its thinking and action will be along the lines of progress. In fact progress is already evident everywhere. Rich in natural resources, it is rapidly developing these. It is first in the production of rice, prominent in cotton leads the South in grain, ranks high in lumber production and stands alone in the yield of Perique tobacco and Tabasco sauce.

"And to take care of this rapidly increasing industrial yield good roads are covering the state. Many individual parishes have voted bonds of \$2,000,000 or more each for this purpose, while two great transcontinental thoroughfares, Jefferson Highway from New Orleans to Winnipeg, and Dixie Highway, running east and west, cross the state.

By the National Education Association Louisiana is credited with having one of the best public school systems in the Union, the public school building being the best structure in many of our cities, towns and villages.

"What remains to make the Evangelical the garden spot of all our Southland? The sanctifying touch of evangelical Christianity. Already Baptists outnumber all other Protestants combined and are increasing three times as rapidly as the population of the state.

"Two great needs stand out prominently in our state. One is that of strong men in our new industrial towns which grow up overnight. Many saw-mill and oil towns and one sulphur town have grown so rapidly that it is impossible for the local people to care for their own religious needs. We must have a strongly financed state mission board to take hold of these situations, erect good buildings, secure strong men who will be equal to the demands. But an aggressive policy is needed not only in these industrial centers but in the many growing agricultural sections.

"The other great need is an educational center strong enough to cope with a great situation and shot through with a holy zeal for our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. The Baptist 75 Million Campaign will supply both of these needs. For the first time in history an evangelical mission board strong enough to handle the situation will be on the field in Louisiana. When the campaign shall have added over a million dollars to the endowment and equipment of Louisiana College, then for the first time there will exist a Christian educational institution of learning in Louisiana strong enough to make itself felt throughout the body politic.

"Of course, the success of the campaign will bring many other good things to Louisiana, it will provide a thoroughly-equipped hospital at Alexandria and in a suitable place, an orphan's home with adequate lands and buildings. It will make of the Baptist Bible Institute at New Orleans a great center of education and evangelism. It will prepare the Acadia Academy at "Hatch Point to do effective work among the French children of South Louisiana. It will greatly stimulate church building and in many ways it will mean the development of the religious life of one of the greatest of all our states. I believe the campaign will mean more for Louisiana than for any other state."
