CHIHUAHUA CITY IS IN HANDS OF REBELS

Calles Announces Capture of One of Largest Cities in North Mexico.

Agua Prieta, Sonora.—Chihuahua City, capital of the state of the same name, is definitely in the hands of the revolutionists. It was announced by General P. Elias Calles Saturday.

General Ignacio Enrique, candidate for governor of Chihuahua, according to General Calles, was at Santa Isabel with 4500 state militia, marching toward Chihuahua to reinforce General Eusebio Martinez and Colonel Francisco Arco, former federal commander, who deserted with his troops.

Telegraphic communication was established between Chihuahua City, Santa Isabel, Hermosillo, capital of Sonora, and military headquarters Saturday. General Calles said he was in direct communication with General Enrique.

The revolutionists control virtually all Northern Chihuahua. It was said, with the exception of Juarez, opposite El Paso, Tex., and Casas Grandes, near the Sonora boundary.

At Casas Grandes Carranza troops have been concentrating for three weeks for an attempt to invade Sonora and wrest the state from the revolutionary leaders.

The revolutionists claim they have between 5000 and 6000 troops under their command in Chihuahua. These include infantry, cavalry and "defense societies" or "home guards."

General Calles issued a statement which said in part: "The revolution is sweeping forward beyond all expectations. In less than ninety days Carranza will be deposed. Justice once more will prevail in Mexico. The Carranza forces are revolting so rapidly there is no failure."

Galveston Picked for 1921 Labor Convention

Cleburne, Tex.—Galveston was selected as the place for the 1921 convention of the Texas Federation of Labor Friday.

The convention adopted resolutions favoring the following: An amendment to the state constitution under which the state would underwrite compensation insurance for workmen; immediate action by the state industrial welfare commission toward fixing the minimum wage for women and minors; repeal of the poll tax laws; a law making peaceful picketing legal; making 48 hours a week, instead of 54, the legal maximum for women to work and applying the 54-hour law to small towns.

Resolutions opposing the following were also adopted: The open shop movement, senators and congressmen "who," the resolution said, "represented Wall Street by voting for the Eitch-Cummings bill"; closing theatres and moving picture shows on Sunday, but favoring a six-day week for employees.

Milton Smashes World's Auto Record.

Daytona, Fla.—With flames bursting from beneath the hood of his sixteen-cylinder automobile at the finish line, Tommy Milton Tuesday further reduced his own world's record for one and two miles.

Paris.—The French aviator, R. Renaud, one of the competitors in the trans-Mediterranean flight from Monaco to Bizerta, Tunis and back is missing since he left Cagliari. (Cagliari is in the southern part of the island of Sardinia, in the Mediterranean.)

P. O. Inspector Resigns.

Austin, Tex.—C. E. Anderson has resigned as postoffice inspector in charge for Texas and Oklahoma. Mr. Anderson had served nearly 39 years of service in the interior and postoffice departments of the government.

Telephone Company Pays State Tax.

Austin, Tex.—The Southwestern Telegraph and Telephone Company Wednesday paid the state a tax of \$37,523 on gross receipts of \$2,501,652 for the quarter ending March 31, 1920.

Indians Must Have Burro Meat.

Agua Prieta, Sonora.—Mayo Indians being sent to Agua Prieta to reinforce other Sonora revolutionists do not eat meat from cattle. General Calles, commander in chief of the Sonora troops, said he had ordered 1000 burros for meat for the Indians, to which they have no objection.

Increased Pullman Rates.

Washington.—Increased Pullman rates amounting to 20 per cent went into effect Saturday.

Bellville, Tex.—The census of the Bellville Independent School District for the year 1920-21 shows 340 white and 113 colored.


