CARLOAD OF HOGS ASSURED.

Marksville, La., July.—My carload of hogs for club shipment in November is assured, writes F. A. Swann, parish agent of Avoyelles Parish. But in order that there be no doubt what- ever, I am getting a few extra hogs. Most of my club members will run their hogs on permanent pasture this summer and will turn pigs on velvet beans this fall, and will harden off with corn. This method will greatly reduce the cost of pork and will enable members to put extra good hogs on the market. Trees are being budded now and more will be budded in August. The agent with the assistance of a progressive farmer will bud Satsuma oranges on trifoliata stock.
