

PROCEEDINGS OF THE PARISH SCHOOL BOARD

Arcadia, La., March 27, 1919. The Bienville Parish School Board met in the Superintendent's office, in regular session on the above named date and at the above named place with the following members present: J. W. Sutton, ward one; G. L. Wren, ward two; G. R. Boone, ward three; J. F. Couly, Jr., ward four; H. N. Hays, ward five; J. E. Roden, ward six; and P. F. White of ward seven, and a quorum.

The following resolutions offered by Mr. J. W. Sutton and seconded by Mr. J. E. Roden were unanimously carried:

- 1. RESOLVED by the Parish Board of School Directors of the Parish of Bienville, Louisiana, in regular session convened, that the whole of Bienville Parish, La., be and the same is hereby created into one Public School District which shall be known as the Bienville Parish School District.
2. THAT AN ELECTION in the whole parish be ordered to be held on SATURDAY, MAY 17, 1919, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified electors of said parish the question of electing a special tax of 5 mills on the dollar on the assessed valuation of the property of said parish for a period of ten (10) years as a means of providing a maintenance fund for the public schools of Bienville Parish.
3. THAT in the event said tax is voted that all special school district taxes which have heretofore been voted and levied in Bienville Parish, except those voted for building purposes, shall be cancelled and not collected.
4. THAT ALL TAXES which have been voted for building purposes shall be so reduced in each case that the millage will provide only sufficient revenue to meet the needs for which the tax was voted.

AN ORDINANCE

Ordering a special election to be held in Bienville Parish School District for the purpose of submitting to the qualified electors of said district the question of a tax on all property subject to state taxation, for a special tax of 5 mills on the dollar on all property subject to state taxation annually for a period of ten years for the purpose of providing for additional aid to the public schools of said district.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Parish Board of School Directors of the Parish of Bienville, La., that a special election be and the same is hereby ordered to be held in the Bienville Parish School District on the 17 day of May, 1919 for the purpose of submitting to the qualified electors of the said school district entitled to vote on the question of the levy of a special tax of five mills on the dollar on all property subject to state taxation annually for a period of ten years, the proceeds of said tax to be used in giving aid to the public schools of said school district.

Section 2. Be it further ordained, etc that the ballots to be used at the said election shall be prepared by the Secretary of the Bienville Parish Board of School Directors and shall be in the following form:

Proposition to levy a 5 mill tax on all property subject to state taxation in Bienville Parish School Dis. annually for a period of ten years for the purpose of giving additional aid to the public schools of the said district.

NOTICE TO VOTERS—to vote in favor of the proposition submitted upon this ballot, place a cross "X" mark in the square after the word "yes"; to vote against it place a similar mark after the word "no".

Section 3. Be it further ordained etc., that the Secretary of the Parish Board of School Directors be, and he is hereby ordered to cause to be prepared for use at the said election the tally sheets, lists of qualified electors, assessed valuation of property, blank statements for the compilation of the votes, in number and amount and other election blanks that may be required for the purpose of holding the said election, to cause the same to be placed in the ballot boxes for use at the respective precincts, and to make provision for the transmission of the ballot boxes to the several precincts of the school district at which the election is to be held.

Section 4. Be it further ordained etc., that the polling places or precincts for the said election shall be, and the following three commissioners and clerks are appointed to each respective polling place:
