VICTORY FAIR WILL BE HELD IN MONROE, OCT.

Exhibits and Amusements Will Please Visitors From Neighboring Cities and Adjacent Territory

Visitors to the Ouachita Agricultural Fair at Monroe, October 14-17 will find every moment of their time occupied by the many and varied exhibits and the high-class amusements offered. The exhibits cover every article and animal that is prized by the people of the South and will be of the highest class. The amusements include the usual gladway shows, minstrel show, con shows, freaks, curiosities, doll racks, ferris wheel, animal show, and several others, all of a higher class than is usually seen at parish fairs.
