George R. Madden

On Tuesday, September 2, 1919, George R. Madden, after an illness of many months, departed this life. He was laid to rest on Wednesday, in the Madden cemetery, near his home, Rev. Holcomb of Mansfield, performing the last sad rites.

Uncle George was a resident of this parish, living near Hope. He was born on February 25, 1852; making him at the time of his death, 67 years, 6 months, and 15 days of age. SPRAY FRUIT TREES WHEN LEAVES DROP

Spray the fruit trees as soon as the leaves drop this fall to combat the San Jose scale, advises B. Szymoniak, associate horticulturist, Extension Division, Louisiana State University. To do the spraying efficiently it is necessary to have the right kind of a pump, plenty of rubber hose, extension rod and an angle nozzle. In buying a spraying outfit always specify that fifteen feet of hose is required, a 6 foot bamboo rod, cut-off and disc nozzle, otherwise the spray pump will not be properly equipped. As there is a scarcity of nursery trees, it is more important than ever to take care of the trees that are already growing.

San Jose scale is the worst enemy of the fruit trees. Prepare now to spray this fall.


