DR. GARFIELD SIGNS ORDER

OLD PRIORITIES LIST FOR FUEL IS REVIVED.

United States Fuel Administrator to Re-establish War-Time Regulations.

Washington.—Fuel Administrator Garfield signed the distribution and diversion orders of the Fuel Administration, under which the old list of priorities immediately becomes effective.

The preferred list as it will now stand will operate in this order:

Railroads, army and navy and other government departments, state and county offices and institutions, public utilities; retail dealers, manufacturing plants on the War Industries Board preference list; industries not on the list, jobbers, lake steamers at tidewater.

Railroad Director General Hines notifies all regional directors to carry out the order which gives them authority to seize and divert coal in transit.

While no action is contemplated now with regard to anthracite coal, Dr. Garfield said that the course of prices would be watched carefully. "Just the moment anthracite coal shows any disposition to get away," he said, "maximum price orders will be revived to stop profiteering."

Restoration of the priorities list means a virtual embargo on the export of coal, for there will be none available for that purpose.

"Our first duty is to protect the public," Dr. Garfield said. "It would have required too much time to set up the old machinery of the Fuel Administration, so the Department of Justice will have charge of seeing that the maximum price list is observed and the Railroad Administration, when its staff already in the field, will direct the distribution."

HELD FOR SHOOTING DUCKS

Iowa Game Warden Obtains Information Against Three Men; Hunters Held For Grand Jury.

Keokuk, Io.—A United States Game Warden has obtained information here against three men, charging them with violation of that part of the Federal law which prohibits the shooting of ducks from a power boat. Two of the men, W. W. Perdue and John Perdue, have been held for the Federal Grand Jury, and the third, Ira E. Spangler is to have a hearing later. They were caught hunting in a motor boat.

The law involved provides a maximum penalty of \$500 fine and six months' imprisonment. It provides that ducks may not be shot from an airplane, a power boat. Instructions are said to have been sent from Washington to Game Wardens to enforce the statute strictly.

Hopes for Treaty Ratification. London.—The German peace treaty may come into effect on the anniversary of Armistice Day. It was announced by Cecil Harmsworth, under secretary for foreign affairs, in the House of Commons, that the government hoped the treaty would be formally ratified on November 11 and come into force the same day.

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
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
