TEACHERS HOLD INTERESTING MEETING HERE

The teachers of Bienville Parish assembled last Friday morning in regular session for the Parish Institute. Of the one hundred fourteen teachers of this parish there were ninety-seven present. This speaks well for the teachers of Bienville Parish and their interest in school welfare.

After the introductory remarks from Supt. E. H. Fisher, the work of the institute was begun.

Mr. C. A. Ives, State High School Inspector, addressed the high school teachers making mention of the changes in the course of study, and stressing thoroughness of work.

At the same time Miss Margaret Graham addressed the teachers of the elementary departments and rural schools on "Reading." Her central theme was the vast importance of teaching children to read, because all that is learned in life must largely come by reading.

Mr. Ives later made a short address to the entire institute. This was both instructive and inspiring.

Miss Graham then told a real fairy story much to the delight of every one. Friday afternoon was given to round table discussion along the lines of local problems.

The evening program was composed of short talks from several teachers of the parish. Mrs. Capers with some of her music class rendered some splendid selections both piano and vocal.

The last session of the institute was held Saturday morning. Mr. G. L. Wren, Supervisor of Rural Schools gave an interesting report on splendid work of our rural teachers.

Mr. Phillips of the Department of Education of Louisiana Industrial Institute favored us with an able address. His main topics for discussion were "purposeful activity" on the part of students and the "value of supervised study."

Supt. Fisher made a few general closing remarks. On motion the visiting teachers gave a rising vote of appreciation to the people of Arcadia and Mr. Wagner and his faculty for the kindness and hospitality shown them.

We feel sure that every teacher went back to their several places of abode with a determination to strive harder and accomplish greater and more lasting results.

The work of the institute was interesting and extremely beneficial and full of enthusiasm, all of these help wonderfully as the teachers try to carry on the work of education in Bienville Parish.

Revival Planned For Entire South

Widest Evangelistic Effort Ever Made Will Be Launched Soon.

Nashville, Tenn.—Plans for an evangelistic movement which will cover the entire South and operate in 20,000 churches at the same time are being formulated by the Centenary Commission and the evangelist committee of the M. E. Church, South.

Bishop U. V. W. Darlington is the chairman of the joint directing committee and Dr. O. E. Goddard is the executive secretary.

Standard Plan Made.
The movement will operate according to a standard plan. This plan provides for a preliminary survey of the entire South to discover what persons are not affiliated with any religious denomination.

Dr. A. C. Zumbunnen is in charge of the survey, and he has made preliminary investigations in a large number of typical sections as samples to guide pastors in surveying their own fields.

When these surveys are completed the evangelistic movement will be launched in an effort to interest all non-church members whose names have been secured.

It has been estimated that half a million workers will be enlisted to personally interview the persons who have no church membership.

CAMPAIGN TO MEAN MUCH IN LOUISIANA

STRONGER SCHOOLS, CHURCHES, HOSPITALS AND ORPHANAGES WILL RESULT FROM DRIVE.

STATE DEVELOPS RAPIDLY

Baptists Hope To Bring Educational and Religious Pace Up To That Maintained Along Industrial Lines.

Pineville, La.—Some of the things which the Baptist 75 Million Campaign will mean for Louisiana are pointed out in an interesting way by Dr. C. Cottingham, president of Louisiana College of this city, as follows:

"Louisiana, one of the newest old states in the Union, although for a while inclined toward the conservatism of the East, has finally adopted the aggressiveness of the West, and henceforth its thinking and action will be along the lines of progress. In fact, progress is already evident everywhere. Rich in natural resources, it is rapidly developing these. It is first in the production of rice, prominent in cotton, leads the South in grain, ranks high in lumber production and stands alone in the yield of Perique tobacco and Tabasco sauce.

"And to take care of this rapidly increasing industrial yield good roads are covering the state. Many individual parishes have voted bonds of \$2,000,000 or more each for this purpose, while two great transcontinental thoroughfares, Jefferson Highway from New Orleans to Winnipeg, and Dixie Highway, running east and west, cross the state. By the National Education Association Louisiana is credited with having one of the best public school systems in the Union, the public school building being

the best structure in many of our cities, towns and villages.
"What remains to make the Evangeline country the garden spot of all our Southland? The sanctifying touch of evangelical Christianity. Already Baptists outnumber all other Protestants combined and are increasing three times as rapidly as the population of the state.

"Two great needs stand out prominently in our state. One is that of strong men in our new industrial towns which grow up overnight. Many saw-mill and oil towns and one sulphur town have grown so rapidly that it is impossible for the local people to care for their own religious needs. We must have a strongly financed state mission board to take hold of these situations, erect good buildings, secure strong men who will be equal to the demands. But an aggressive policy is needed not only in these industrial centers but in the many growing agricultural sections.

"The other great need is an educational center strong enough to cope with a great situation and meet through with a holy zeal for our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. The Baptist 75 Million Campaign will supply both of these needs. For the first time in his history an evangelical union board strong enough to handle the situation will be on the field in Louisiana. When the campaign shall have added over a million dollars to the endowment and equipment of Louisiana College, then for the first time there will exist a Christian educational institution of learning in Louisiana strong enough to make itself felt throughout the body politic.

"Of course, the success of the campaign will bring many other good things to Louisiana. It will provide a thoroughly-equipped hospital at Alexandria, and in a suitable place, an orphan's home with adequate lands and buildings. It will make of the Baptist Bible Institute at New Orleans a great center of education and evangelism. It will prepare the Acadia Academy at Church Point to do effective work among the French children of South Louisiana. It will greatly stimulate church building and in many ways it will mean the development of the religious life of one of the greatest of all our states. I believe the campaign will mean more for Louisiana than for any other state."
