

Methodist Church Enters Ypres and Brussels

MEMORIAL CHURCH WILL BE ERECTED IN DEVASTATED BELGIAN CITY.

To Be Center of Large Enterprise On the Part of Southern Methodists.

Tenn.—A great Methodist church, erected and maintained by the Southern Methodist Church, South, is being erected in the ruins of Belgium. This was stated by W. B. Beauchamp, director of the Centenary Commission, at the Bishop James Atkins, the charge of European mission returned from Belgium. The city of Ypres, terribly devastated by the war, is being rebuilt in its entirety. A magnificent Cloth Hall, the world's largest, the Cathedral, the churches, and other buildings will be left as a perpetual memorial to the city's suffering. The city mayor has caused to be erected, reading: "This ground. No stone of this fabric taken away. It is a heritage of civilized peoples."

A City of Memorials. The government has selected a site for a great museum as a memorial to her fallen heroes. The buildings will be built by New Zealand, Australia and

amidst these memorials the Methodist Church will be erected. It will contain a library, room and social equipment, and to its auditorium and

will always be a mecca for the people. Dr. Beauchamp said millions will flock to the church. Our church will not be a center to the people of Ypres and surrounding territory, but it will serve these visitors."

Plant in Brussels. Methodists have also purchased a building in Brussels, which will be their headquarters for Europe. It contains offices, an auditorium, lecture rooms, a publishing house and social equipment. Secretaries of the two bodies of Belgium, the church and the free church, will meet in this building, thus making it the Protestant center of the continent.

Methodists have also purchased a half interest in the Protestant church of Brussels. It will be a great church and its capacity will be increased.

Stations Established. Beauchamp reported that thousands of children will freeze to death in winter, because the Germans have taken the mines and filled them with dynamite, thus making it impossible to obtain fuel. The women with their mothers," said Beauchamp, "are now living in crowded trenches and dug-outs."

Church has a fund of \$5,000,000 for European construction work. This is spent in Serbia, France, Belgium and Bohemia.

PERSONAL MENTION

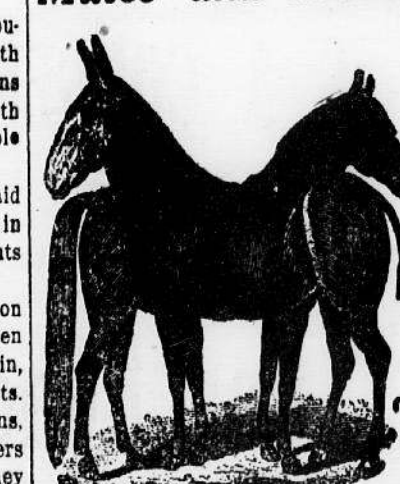
J. T. Toms of Bienville, and J. W. Sutton of Bear Creek, were among the out-of-town visitors here, this week.

Christians Invade The Holy Land

Southern Methodists Send First Work-ers To Palestine for Bible and Literature Distribution.

(Special Correspondence)

Nashville, Tenn.—The Methodist Episcopal Church, South, has the distinction of being the first Christian denomination to send workers to Palestine since the free regime inaugurated under the occupancy of General Allenby.

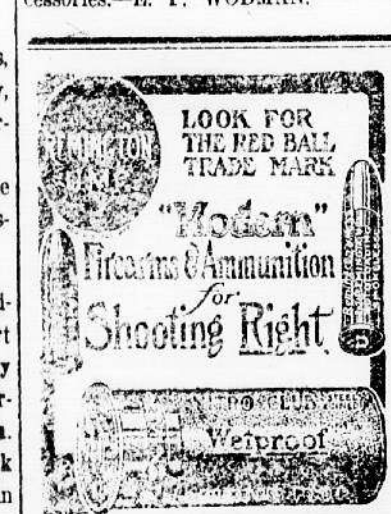
The Centenary European Commission of the Church, headed by Bishop James Atkins and Dr. W. B. Beauchamp, have already dispatched five colonporters to the Holy Land. These will be followed by five more in the next few weeks.

These workers will establish no stations, but will follow the early Methodist custom of itinerating over the country distributing Bibles, tracts and Christian literature.

This literature will be printed in the native dialects, and will be secured through an arrangement with the Nile Press in Egypt.

Under the rule of the Turk such a movement would have been prohibited, but under Allenby there is perfect freedom of religions. The action of the Southern Methodists is the beginning of a vast scheme of missionary activity which will be carried on in the Holy Land.

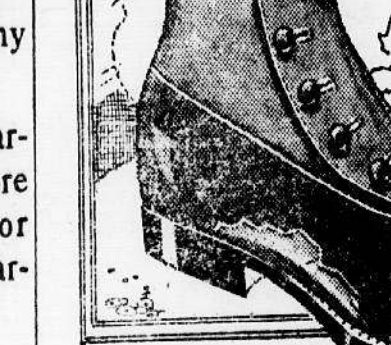
