### LEGAL BATTLE WON BY PLAINTIFFS IN OIL CASE

In the suit brought against Ed R. Loe by various and sundry parties in this parish, and especially in the territory between the Congress Oil Co., well on the Davis tract and the Werlly well on the Jordan tract, to annul leases taken by the defendant, the plaintiff's feel that they have been victorious, in that they have obtained judgement against Ed. R. Loe for the purchase price as set forth in each individual lease, but which they alleged had never been paid.

The court holds, however, that on account of the leases appearing on record showing a valid consideration to have been paid and passing into the hands of innocent third parties, who purchased on the face of the record, the said third parties were decreed the owners of the leases.

The plaintiffs in these suits numbering about 35 were ably represented by Messrs. Taylor and Barksdale of the local bar. The defendants were represented by J. Rush Wimberly of the local bar and Messrs. Randolph, Wise, Rendall & Crye of Shreveport.

Every foot of the ground was hotly contested in this suit, the trial of which case was several days in duration, Judge Reynolds rendering his decision last Thursday.


