CHARTER

Bank of Commerce, Gibsland, La.

State of Louisiana, Parish of Bienville.

Be it known that before me, W. C. Langford, a Notary Public, in and for the Parish of Bienville, State of Louisiana, duly commissioned and sworn, personally came and appeared, on this 10th day of May, A. D., one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one (1921), the several persons whose names are hereinafter mentioned and hereto subscribed who severally declared: That they are citizens of this state, and that availing themselves of the Constitution and the laws of the State of Louisiana, in such cases made and provided, they have covenanted and agreed and do hereby covenant and agree and bind themselves as well as all other persons who may hereafter become associated with them, to form a Banking Corporation and under the following articles, to-wit:

Article 1.
The name and style of this corporation shall be Bank of Commerce, and under said corporate name shall have and enjoy succession for a period of ninety nine (99) years; to have and use a corporate seal; to sue and be sued; to plead and be impleaded; to appear and answer and prosecute in any and all courts of this state and elsewhere.

Article 2.
The Corporation shall have and possess all powers granted to banking associations under and by virtue of the terms and conditions of the banking laws of the State of Louisiana, and especially of Act 179, of 1902 and all acts amendatory thereto.

Article 3.
The domicile of this corporation shall be Gibsland, Bienville Parish, State of Louisiana.

Article 4.
All citation or other legal process shall be served upon the president of said corporation, or in his absence upon the vice-president, or in the absence of both upon the cashier of said corporation.

The Capital Stock of this corporation is hereby fixed at thirty thousand (\$30,000.00) Dollars, divided into three hundred (300) shares of the par value of one hundred dollars (\$100) each. Said stock shall be represented by certificates of stock signed by the president and cashier, and in the absence of the president, by the vice-president, and shall be transferable upon the books of the corporation only upon surrender of proof of loss or destruction of the outstanding certificates, and no stockholder shall be entitled to vote any shares of stock transferred to him within twenty days preceding any election. The capital stock of this corporation shall be paid for in cash, as prescribed by law.

Article 5.
The affairs of this corporation shall

be managed by a board of not less than nine (9) nor more than fifteen (15) directors, a majority of whom shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. The following persons are hereby designated as the first Board of Directors, who shall serve and hold office until the second Tuesday in January, 1922:

Article 7.
The Board of Directors shall be elected annually on the second Tuesday of January of each year, except the first board as shown by this charter, which board shall serve until its successors shall have been elected and qualified.

All elections shall be by ballot and conducted at the office of the corporation under the supervision of three commissioners to be appointed by the Board of Directors. Notice of election shall be given by publication for not less than ten (10) days prior to such election in a newspaper published in the Parish of Bienville or in event there should be no newspaper published in the parish, then in a newspaper recognized as the official journal of the state, and by written notice mailed to each stockholder. Every stockholder shall be entitled to one vote for each share of stock outstanding in his name or on the books of the corporation for at least twenty days prior to the election, and the vote of the stockholders shall be cast in person or by written proxy, and a majority of the votes cast shall elect. Any vacancies occurring among the directors by death, resignation or otherwise shall be filled for the remainder of the term by electing directors at the date specified shall not dissolve the corporation, but the directors then in office shall remain in office until their successors are elected and qualified, and shall have authority to call a special election, without published notice, to elect a new board. The first board of directors have authority to call a special election from their number by ballot, a president, two or more vice-presidents and a cashier, who shall act as secretary of the corporation, and the said board may appoint such committees, office managers, clerks, commissioners, agents or employees as may be necessary to carry on the business of the corporation and said employees shall hold office and shall be delegated such authority as the Board of Directors may see fit. Said board shall also make and establish at will, by-laws, rules and regulations for the proper management and conduct of the business of this corporation. All the cor-

porate powers of this corporation are hereby vested in said board of directors, except such as may be reserved by law, and these articles of incorporation, to the stockholders. The seal of this corporation shall be in the custody of the cashier, and shall be in the form Emblem of State of Louisiana.

Article 8.
The capital stock of this corporation and number of shares may be increased or diminished, or this charter may be modified, changed or amended, or the said corporation may be dissolved with the assent of two-thirds of the amount of the capital stock of this corporation given at a general meeting of the stockholders convened for the purpose, after due notice of said meeting shall have been published in a newspaper for thirty days prior to the convening of said meeting and by written notice mailed to each stockholder addressed to his residence as it appears on the books of the corporation.

Article 9.
Whenever this corporation may be dissolved, either by limitation or by any other cause, its affairs shall be liquidated by three stockholders to be elected at a general meeting of the stockholders to be convened for the purpose, after publication for thirty days, in a newspaper as heretofore set forth, and two thirds of the stock voting at said election shall be required to elect. The said liquidating commissioners elected at said meeting shall remain in office until the affairs of the corporation shall have been completely liquidated, and in case of death of one or more of said commissioners, the vacancy shall be filled by the remaining commissioners.

Thus done and passed in my office in the parish of Bienville, on the day, month and year first above written, in the presence of W. A. McKenzie and W. S. Knighton, legal and competent witnesses, who herewith sign their names, with the said appearers, and me, Notary Public, after due reading of the whole.
