THE STATE OF LOUISIANA.

PAKISH OF LAFOURCHE. Be it known, that on this the 12th day of the month of December, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and nine, and of the Independence of the United States of America, the one hundred and thirty fourth year.

Before me, Thomas A. Badaux, a notary public in and for the parish of Lafourche, and State of Louisiana, duly commissioned, qualified and sworn, and in the presence of the undersigned, good and competent witnesses.

Personally came and appeared: The persons whose names are hereto subscribed, who declared that availing themselves of the general laws of the State of Louisiana, relative to the organization of corporations, they have contracted, covenanted and agreed, and do by these presents, contract, covenant and agree, bind, form and constitute themselves, as well as any persons who may hereafter join, or become associated with them, into a corporation and body politic in law, for the objects and purposes, and under the agreements and stipulations, following, to-wit:

Article 1. The name and title of this corporation shall be the Paul Scott Co. Limited, and under said corporate name, it shall have power and authority to have and enjoy succession, for the full term and period of ninety-nine years, from the date hereof; to contract, sue and be sued; to make and use a corporate seal, and the same to break or alter at pleasure; to hold, receive, lease, purchase and convey, as well as to mortgage and hypothecate, property, real or personal, corporeal and incorporeal, in name, and appoint such managers, agents, directors and officers as its business or interests and convenience may require; to make and establish, as well as to alter and amend, from time to time, such by-laws, rules and regulations, for the proper conduct, management and regulation of the affairs of said corporation as may be necessary and proper.

Article 2. The domicile of the said corporation shall be the parish of Lafourche, in the State of Louisiana, and all citations and other legal process shall be served on the President of said corporation and in the event of his absence, or inability to act, upon the Vice President thereof, and in the absence of both, upon any one of these officers, upon the Secretary of said corporation.

Article 3. The objects and purposes of this corporation are to engage in the business of planting, cultivating, harvesting and manufacturing of sugar cane and the raising of cane and other crops produced by and from the soil, and to do all things necessary or incidental to the conduct of a planting or manufacturing business.

Article 4. The capital stock of said corporation is hereby declared to be, Ten Thousand Dollars, divided into one hundred shares of one hundred dollars each, payable at such times and in such manner as the Board of Directors may provide.

Article 5. The business affairs of said corporation shall be administered by a Board of Directors not more than three in number and not more than seven, said Board of Directors to be elected annually, on the first Monday of October each year, after the expiration of the term of office herein fixed.

A failure to elect, however, from any cause, shall not work a forfeiture of this charter, but a second election shall be called.

The Board of Directors shall have the power to fill all vacancies occurring in their number.

The Directors shall elect from their body, a President, a Vice President, a Secretary and Treasurer, and the said Board of Directors shall hold their office until their successors are duly elected.

At all elections, each share of stock shall be entitled to one vote, to be cast in person or by proxy, and all elections shall be by ballot.

Until the first Monday of October, 1911, the first Board of Directors shall consist of the following named persons: Arthur A. Scott, President and General Manager; P. Emile Scott, Vice President; L. Alphonse Scott, Secretary and Treasurer; Frank T. Scott and Andrew Scott.

Article 6. The Board of Directors shall have the power generally to supervise the business of the corporation, to adopt general rules for its conduct, to contract for the purchase of whatever may be required for the operation of the property of the corporation in a proper manner; to hire, employ and engage such overseers, managers or superintendents as may be thought necessary, and to fix their salaries and compensation; to mortgage or to pledge the property and effects of the corporation by a majority vote of the Board.

Article 7. Three members of the Board shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business of the corporation. No person shall be qualified to be a member of the Board of Directors unless he shall own at least one share of the capital stock of the corporation.

Article 8. The president shall have general supervision of the administrative affairs of the corporation; he shall preside at all meetings of the Board and shall deal directly with the executive officers of the corporation; he shall be the manager of the finances and of the improvements to the property of the corporation. He is vested with the power granted, by a majority vote of the Board of Directors, to borrow money for the business of the corporation; to make and subscribe notes in representation of the corporation; to endorse notes for discount, and to have full power to pledge any personal property of the corporation, as set forth in a previous Article of this charter.

Article 9. The Treasurer shall be the custodian of the funds of the corporation, which funds shall be deposited in such bank or banks as may be decided on by the Board.

The checks to be drawn on the treasurer shall be signed by the president or the Vice President and countersigned by the Secretary.

Article 10. The Vice president shall exercise the functions of the president in case of the latter's inability to act or absence from the parish.

Article 11. The Secretary shall have charge of the books of the corporation, in which shall be kept the accounts of the revenues and expenditures of the business. These books and records shall be subject to the inspection of any member of the Board of Directors.

Article 12. No stockholder shall be liable or responsible for any sum beyond the amount of his subscription, and he shall be subject to no further call and shall in no way be liable for any of the debts of the corporation.

All creditors must look to the corporate property for their demands, nor shall any mere informality of organization have the effect of rendering this charter null, or of exposing any stockholder to any liability beyond the amount of his subscription.

This charter may be changed, modified or amended, or this corporation may be dissolved by the stockholders at a general meeting called for that purpose, with the assent of three-fourths of the stock present or represented at such meeting. Ten days' notice of such meeting shall be given, either by mailing same to the last known address of each stockholder, or by publication in a newspaper published in the parish of Lafourche. Said notices shall concisely state the objects and purposes for which the meeting is called, and, if by publication, shall be published for ten consecutive days immediately preceding said meeting.

shall be made in accordance with the laws of the State of Louisiana, with reference to the alteration of the capital stock of corporations.

Article 13. All transfers of stock shall be made on the books of the corporation by any stockholder who may desire to make such transfer, and no other transfer shall be recognized by the corporation.

No stockholder shall be permitted to transfer any share of the stock of this corporation unless he shall have first offered it to the other stockholders, who shall have the privilege of buying the same at the price that may be offered for same by any one else, by preference over the person thus offering to buy, and the stock thus bought from another stockholder shall be divided equally among those desiring to purchase if they so wish. No sale of stock to any other person not a stockholder of this corporation shall be valid, unless the same as above mentioned shall first have been made to the other stockholders.

Article 14. Whenever this corporation shall be dissolved by limitation or otherwise, its affairs shall be liquidated by three commissioners elected from among the stockholders, at a meeting of the same convened after thirty days notice to each stockholder in writing. These liquidating commissioners shall remain in office until their functions and duties are fully discharged and completed, provided that this shall not be for more than six months. Any vacancy in the number of these commissioners shall be filled at a meeting of the stockholders called for that purpose, after the notice of thirty days above set forth.

Article 15. This corporation shall have no operations and transact all business that may come before it from and after the signing of this charter.

Article 16. The number of shares to which each stockholder has subscribed is set opposite his or her name and signature here below and this shall be considered the subscription to stock required by law. Thus done and passed, and signed at my office, in the town of Thibodaux, Louisiana, the day, month and year first above written, in presence of Messrs. Charles J. Coulon and Thomas Bourgeois, residents of the parish of Lafourche, and State of Louisiana, good and competent witnesses, who have signed these presents with the parties and me, notary, after due reading.


