





Meeting of Teachers at Baton Rouge.

The meeting of the Louisiana State Teachers' Association at Baton Rouge, Dec. 29-31, 1902, promises to be one of the most notable gatherings of school people ever held in this State. The population of Baton Rouge, famed for its hospitality, will extend to the visiting teachers a reception which will make their stay at the capital pleasant as well as beneficial. Board will be provided for the teachers at one dollar a day.

Among the well known persons who will deliver addresses to the association are Gov. Heard, Speaker Sanders, Dr. Bailey of the University of Chicago, and Col. Nicholson of the State University. Other eminent men will speak on education and kindred subjects.

Town Visited by Disastrous Fire.

New Iberia, Nov. 12.—Another disastrous fire occurred here this morning at 4 o'clock, completely destroying two residences owned by Mrs. Joseph Clerc of New Orleans and occupied by City Judge R. S. Brown and Coroner W. J. Emmer, and the new Pelican State bandstand, in the band park. All were fully insured except the bandstand and the household effects of Judge Brown. Much of Judge Brown's furniture was removed from the building before its destruction, and was saved. The total loss in the two fires last night is estimated at about \$40,000. The heaviest loss by far was in the fire that destroyed the rice warehouse and the ice plant about 10 p. m.




