A jury of twelve men acquitted Jules Barrere for shooting young Buckeye Foolkes. In the trial Barrere stated that the shooting was an accident. He said that he was walking down the street with a pistol in his pocket when a negro who passed him called his attention to the fact that the weapon was visible. He then took the pistol out of his pocket and held it in his hand when he went into Durand's. Foolkes came along and spoke to him, and in changing his pistol from his right to his left hand in order to shake hands with Foolkes the weapon, in some unexplainable way, went off. The friends of Foolkes don't seem to put much faith in Barrere's testimony; but the jury evidently did for they acquitted him.

The case of Mr. Albert Kohmann who was charged with "shooting with intent to kill" young Brady, came up before court this week. Mr. Kohmann was defended by Mr. L. F. Suthon. The shooting occurred several months ago. Mr. Kohmann was in his buggy driving a horse that was afraid of bicycles when young Brady who was on a bicycle attempted to pass. Mr. Kohmann claims that his horse became frightened and he asked Brady to stop ringing the bell of his bicycle; but that Brady did not do so, when he, Kohmann pulled out his pistol and shot at Brady, more to scare him than any thing else. The bullet inflicted a painful wound. After the shooting Mr. Kohmann assisted the wounded man in getting a physician, sat up with him a part of the night, and showed other evidences that he regretted his deed. Brady's evidence and that of the only witness to the shooting, a negro, differed in some respects from Kohmann's. The jury evidently believed the State's witnesses and rendered a verdict of "guilty." Mr. Kohmann has many friends here who were deeply pained to hear of the trouble he is in. He has lived here all of his life and has always been regarded as a good-natured, peaceable young man.
