SAD ACCIDENT.

Young Eddie Louviere Killed by a Train.

Last Sunday evening Eddie Louviere aged 19 or 20 years, and a resident of Ellendale had both of his legs cut off just below the knee, and died in New Orleans, while in the ambulance on his way to the Charity Hospital. Louvier attempted to get on the Houma Branch passenger train near Ellendale while the train was in motion. He slipped and fell between the cars, and in less time than it takes to tell it, the unfortunate young man's legs got under the car wheels and were crushed off. He was put on the train and brought to Houma where he received the attention of several of Houma's best surgeons. In order that his life might be saved it was thought best to send him to New Orleans. The Southern Pacific furnished a special train that took young Louviere to Schriever to meet an excursion train that was returning to New Orleans. Young Louviere died just before he reached the Hospital. The unfortunate young man, was steady and industrious and the only son and principal support of his parents who were overwhelmed with sorrow by the deadful accident.


