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
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CHARTER OF THE "BLANCHARD POOL OIL COMPANY INCORPORATED"

UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, STATE OF LOUISIANA, PARISH OF TERREBONNE

Be it known that on this 7th day of the month of October, in the year of our Lord, One Thousand Nine Hundred and Fifteen, and of the independence of the United States of America, the One Hundred and Twenty-ninth year of the said United States of America, the undersigned, Notary Public, duly commissioned and qualified and sworn in and for the Parish of Terrebonne, State of Louisiana, and in the presence of Messrs. Herbert L. Chauvin, and Frank Wurzlów, two good and competent witnesses, residing in the Parish and State aforesaid and hereinafter undersigned:

Personally came and appeared the parties whose names are hereinafter subscribed, all legally qualified to join herein, which appears declared that availing themselves of the provisions of the constitution and laws of the State of Louisiana, in such cases provided, relative to the organization of corporations, covenant and agree and do hereby bind themselves and those who hereafter become associated with them for the objects and purpose and under the stipulations and agreements hereinafter set forth, as a corporation and body politic hereby accepting and adopting the same as their charter, to wit:

ARTICLE I.

The name and title of this corporation hereby formed, shall and is declared to be "Blanchard Pool Oil Company, Incorporated", and under its corporate name it shall have the power to contract, sue and be sued, to make and use a corporate seal and the same to break or alter at pleasure; to hold, receive, hire, lease, rent, purchase, let, sell, convey, pledge, or mortgage property real and personal; to lend or borrow money and to issue notes, bonds or other obligations or evidences of indebtedness or responsibility.

ARTICLE II.

The objects and purposes for which this corporation is organized and the nature of business to be conducted by it are declared to be, as follows:

To drill and operate for oil, gas, sulphur, salt, coal, water or any mineral or metal substances; to acquire hold and operate, either by purchase, lease or otherwise, hotel, personal and real property, for the purpose of making explorations for oil, gas, sulphur, salt, coal, water, or any mineral or metal substances; as well as for the purpose of erecting machinery or storage tanks and to operate such machinery and tanks, in connection with the aforesaid explorations, as of pipe lines, or other conduits for the purpose of marketing the aforesaid products; to purchase, sell and otherwise deal in all of the above named products; to own and operate all such machinery, railroads, pipe lines, water craft and to maintain and operate such offices and warehouses as may be necessary in the premises; to acquire, to hold and operate tramways, telephone and telegraph lines, and all necessary rights of way and franchises in connection with the aforesaid purposes; to erect, operate, or maintain such refineries or plants as may be necessary or requisite in the operation, purchase or sale of any of the above named products; to purchase or otherwise acquire stocks and bonds of other corporations operating along any or all of the lines as above set forth to the extent and under the limitations provided by law; to make, name and appoint such officers, managers, clerks, agents and employees as the interest and convenience of this corporation may require; in acquiring leases or in the purchase of property, good will, machinery or other property movable or immovable necessary to carry out the purposes as above set forth, this corporation stock shall be issued and given in exchange, in lieu of money, for the purchase price, as is provided for by law; to make and establish such by-laws, rules and regulations, as may be necessary and proper, and the same to alter and change at pleasure and to do all such acts and things and to engage in any and all business enterprises herein set forth; and to exercise all rights, powers, advantages and immunities granted by law to corporations.

ARTICLE III.

The domicile of this corporation shall be in the City of Houma, Parish of Terrebonne, State of Louisiana and all citations or other legal process shall be served upon the president of the Corporation; and in his absence upon the vice-president; or, in the absence of both of these officials, upon the secretary, otherwise services shall be made in accordance with law, and this corporation, unless sooner dissolved shall have a continued existence of a period of fifty years.

ARTICLE IV.

The capital stock of this corporation is fixed at One Hundred Thousand Dollars and be represented by Ten Thousand shares of the par value of Ten Dollars each.

The capital stock upon compliance with law, may be increased to (\$.....).

This corporation shall be authorized to commence business and become a going concern when Fifty per cent of the capital shall have been subscribed for, either in cash or property, and the capital stock shall be transferable on the books of the corporation by the stockholders, in person or by proxy, but no transfer shall be recognized, except if registered until the stock shall have been offered to the stockholders through the Board of Directors at the same price as to bona fide and obtainable from the parties, and the original stockholders to have an option on the same at such price

for a period of ten days from the date of such offer; the stock so offered to be prorated among the stockholders desiring to exercise such option in the same proportion that their holdings then bear to each other.

All shares of stock shall be full paid non-assessable and no transfer of stock shall be binding upon the corporation, unless recorded in the books; provided that nothing in this act shall be construed as prohibiting the endorsement of the said blank or validly, pledging it as collateral, in which the endorsement, transferee or pledgee shall possess and enjoy the ownership or rights therein or thereto as evidenced by such endorsement, transfer or pledge subject to the exercise of the option hereinabove written for the benefit of the original stockholders.

ARTICLE V.

All the corporate powers of the corporation and the full management of its affairs shall be vested in and exercised by a Board of Directors, to be composed of five stockholders, three of whom shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business which Board of Directors shall be elected annually at a stockholders meeting on the first Monday after the first day of November each year beginning with the year 1916. All elections shall be by ballot, each stockholder being entitled to one vote for each share owned by him, and the majority of the votes cast shall elect.

Written notice of each annual stockholders meeting shall be mailed to each stockholder at least ten days prior thereto; but any failure to hold such a meeting or to elect directors shall not invalidate this corporation nor the acts of any of its officers, but the incumbent Board of Directors shall continue to serve until their successors are elected and qualified at any stockholders meeting called and held for that purpose, after ten days written notice to each stockholder.

The Board of Directors shall at its first meeting select from among its number a president, a vice-president, a secretary and treasurer, both of the latter positions may be held by the same director, but the secretary shall not necessarily be a director.

Any vacancy on the Board may be filled for the unexpired term by the directors.

It shall be the duty of the Board of Directors to formulate such by-laws, rules and regulations defining the duties, rights, salaries and powers of the several officers, and concerning the management and conduct of the corporate business as they may deem advisable, wise and consistent with this charter and the laws of the State, and to alter, revoke or change the same at any regular meeting of the Board.

The first Board of Directors shall consist of J. Arthur Despit, Houma, La., President; Teles P. Blanchard, Bourg, La., Vice-President; Paul J. Dupont, Houma, La., Treasurer; Milton R. Beauvais, Houma, La., Secretary; J. W. Carson, Paradis, La.,

ARTICLE VI.

This act of incorporation may be amended or this corporation dissolved in accordance with the provisions of law in such cases made and provided.

ARTICLE VIII.

No stockholder of this corporation shall ever be liable or responsible for any contracts of faults hereof in any further sum than the unpaid balance due on the stock subscribed for, nor shall any informality in organization have the effect of rendering this charter null or of exposing a stockholder to any greater liability than any unpaid balance upon the par value of this stock.

The subscribers hereto have written opposite their names the number of shares subscribed for so that this act may serve as the original subscription list. And there is annexed hereto an accurate detailed and itemized description of such property, as to amount, location, extent, character and State of improvement, together with a statement of its value as appraised by the directors herein, as is subscribed or tendered in whole or in part payment for capital stock.

Thus done and passed at my office in the City of Houma, State and Parish aforesaid on the day and month and year first above written.
