CHARTER

STATE OF LOUISIANA, PARISH OF TERREBONNE,

BE IT KNOWN: That on this sixth day of January, in the year of our Lord Nineteen Hundred and Twenty,

Before me, HENRY M. BOURG, a Notary Public, duly qualified and sworn in and for the Parish of Terrebonne, State aforesaid, and in the presence of the witnesses hereinafter named and undersigned.

PERSONALLY CAME AND APPEARED: Ira Thibodaux; James W. Miller; Bernard Chiasson; P. Frank Kurtz; Leonce C. Doiron; Arthur J. Bethancourt; Albert J. Doiron; Gibson J. Autin; Arthur Hebert; Louis Mohana; Joseph Doiron; and Jules A. Levron (whose postoffice addresses are all: Rouma, La., all residents of the Parish of Terrebonne, in this State, who declared:

That availing themselves of the provisions of the laws of this State relative to the formation of corporations for religious, scientific, literary or charitable purposes and to acquire the rights, privileges, and powers of a body politic in law, they do hereby acquire themselves as well as such other persons who become associated with them, into such a corporation and body politic under the name and style, and for the purposes hereinafter specially set forth.

ARTICLE I
The name of this corporation shall be: HOUMA VOLUNTEER FIRE COMPANY NO. 1.

ARTICLE II
Its domicile shall be in the city of Houma, La.

ARTICLE III
The objects and purposes of this corporation shall be to own, by purchase or otherwise, fire engines and fire fighting equipment, hose-carts, trucks, engine houses, and accessories, to establish and maintain a fire department, for the benefit of the city and surrounding territory, to acquire property, buildings, and housings for the carrying on and operation of said department, to provide rest-rooms, of recreation, amusement and entertainment, for its members and the public generally, to assist sick and disabled firemen and their families, and to render them aid when in distress, to render aid and assistance in cases of conflagrations or fires, and assist in need and distress, and generally to enjoy and exercise all the rights, privileges and functions of a well organized and established fire department for the benefit of the community.

ARTICLE IV
The officers of this corporation shall consist of a President, Vice-President, Secretary and a Treasurer, who shall be elected annually from the membership of the company and who shall serve for one year or until their successors are elected and inducted into office. The first election hereunder, shall be held on the first Monday in June, 1920. Until that time the following have been chosen to serve in the following manner: Gibson J. Autin, shall be President; Harry Heiler, vice-president; James W. Miller, Secretary, and Albert Doiron, Treasurer. The said corporation shall have authority to select from its members a suitable person to serve as Chief of the Fire Department, who may receive such compensation as may be fixed by the company and who shall serve until the first Monday in June 1920 or until his successor shall be chosen and installed.

ARTICLE V
The membership dues shall be twenty-five cents per month but may be increased at any regular

meeting of the membership by a majority vote of those present. Persons desiring to become members shall submit an application, accompanied by such recommendations as the company may provide in its by-laws and shall be voted upon as may be provided therein.

ARTICLE VI
The qualifications for membership shall be provided for in the by-laws, and no one except such persons having such qualifications shall be admitted to membership.

ARTICLE VII
The president of this association and in his absence the vice-president is hereby designated as the officer upon whom citation or other legal process shall be served; and in the absence of both of these officers then service shall be made upon the secretary.

ARTICLE VIII
This corporation shall endure and exist for 99 years, unless sooner dissolved. It may be dissolved or the charter may be amended at any time, provided that notice of dissolution or amendment shall be given to each member at least 30 days before the date upon which the dissolution is to take place or the amendment to be proposed and adopted. Upon dissolution the affairs of the corporation shall be wound up and liquidated by the president and two other members chosen from among the general membership who shall serve without pay and shall discharge all their duties according to law and with dispatch.

Whereas, Daniel C. McIntyre, Jr., Administrator of the above succession, has filed a final account of his administration of said succession;




