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The Cook stove, when run to its utmost capacity, will consume only two quarts of oil in 12 hours. There is no kind of cooking it will not do, and do better than any wood or coal stove or range, as the heat is under instant and perfect control. Bread, cake and pies, baked by it, are like those baked in the old-fashioned brick oven. In two minutes after lighting the fire the oven is at a baking heat. With the flames at about two-thirds height only, four loaves, of common size, can be baked evenly through, with tender crust, in 25 to 30 minutes. Steak can be broiled quicker and better than over hickory coals. Broiling, frying, toasting, stewing and roasting can be done with neatness and dispatch.
